The graduate is eligible to take the National Registry licensure examination to become a Paramedic after successful completion of the Rogers State University Emergency Medical Services Program. The Oklahoma State Department of Health – Emergency Medical Services Division governs issuance of Paramedic licenses in Oklahoma. Individuals with a conviction of a felony, are currently on probation, or have been subject to limitation, suspension, or termination of your right to practice in a health care occupation or voluntarily surrendered a health care licensure in any state or to an agency authorizing the legal right to work may not be permitted by the National Registry of EMT's or the State of Oklahoma to take the licensure examination. The Oklahoma State Department of Health and the National Registry of EMT's requires disclosure information concerning these issues at the time of application for licensure. If you have such a history, you should make an appointment with the Coordinator of the EMS Program or contact the Oklahoma State Department of Health – EMS Division for further information concerning licensure questions.

A criminal background check must be completed for all students admitted to the Emergency Medical Services Program. Students with a history of felony conviction or Medicare fraud may not be able to attend clinical faculty laboratories due to agency site contracts. Therefore, these students may be exited at any point in the curriculum due to their inability to complete clinical assignments.

Emergency Medical Services students will be expected to provide services based on human need, with respect for human dignity, unrestricted by consideration of nationality, race, creed, color, or status. This expectation is consistent with the EMT Code of Ethics. Paramedic students will be in clinical courses requiring the application of both gross and fine motor skills, and complex critical thinking skills as an inherent element of emergency services. Usual activities include, but are not limited to assessment and patient management, medication administration via many routes; and some invasive procedures. There always exists potential exposure to blood and body fluids pathogens, sexually transmitted diseases and communicable diseases.

Any material misrepresentation or deliberate omission of a fact in my application may be justification for refusal of, or if admitted, dismissal from the program. To the best of my knowledge all information in this application is correct.
