Thank you for inquiring about Rogers State University's Bachelor of Science in Nursing RN-to-BSN Degree! The bachelor's degree for RNs is designed especially for you, an RN who has completed an associate degree or diploma program. Congratulations on taking the next step toward becoming a more effective clinician and leader in nursing and healthcare.

As a working professional you have many options to attain a bachelor's degree. You may elect to attend the BS/N program full-time or part-time. Required courses and electives may be taken concurrently or in later semesters after you have completed the nursing courses. Admission requirements, nursing course descriptions, the plan of study, and an application are enclosed in this packet.

If you are a first time student at Rogers State University or a re-entering RSU student, you must first contact the Office of Enrollment Management to apply for admission or readmission to RSU. You can apply for admission online or at any of our three campuses, in Markham Hall on the Claremore campus, or at the Pryor or Bartlesville campus. It is important to bring with you your college or university transcripts, especially if you have never attended RSU. If you need additional information on the application process to the university, contact the Office of Enrollment Management at 918-343-7546.
