Hillcat Headlines

Commencement Features First MBA Grads, Largest Graduating Class. RSU's 104th Commencement recognized its largest graduating class, including inaugural graduates from its Master of Business Administration program. More than 740 students participated in ceremonies honoring master's, bachelor's and associate degree candidates. The class of 2016 included RSU's largest group of bachelor's degree students at 421, with an additional 23 students earning degrees from Cameron University as part of the collaborative elementary education degree program between the two universities. Eight MBA students were part of the inaugural MBA class. (May)

RSU, Oklahoma Army National Guard Re-affirm Officer Program. RSU and the Oklahoma Army National Guard on May 9 re-affirmed their commitment to retaining the Guard Officer Leadership (GOLD) Program at the university. The Oklahoma National Guard had announced closure of its officer programs at other Oklahoma schools, but RSU successfully lobbied to retain its program thanks to strong support from its Oklahoma Military Academy Alumni Association. Major General Robbie Asher, Oklahoma's Adjutant General, signed the agreement along with RSU President Dr. Larry Rice during the event. (May)

RSU Reorganizing Academic Schools. RSU is reorganizing its schools, departments and programs to create organization efficiencies within its academic units. The move will reduce the number of schools from three to two and the number of academic departments will be reduced from eleven to ten. The School of Professional Studies will include the Department of Business, the Department of Health Sciences, and the Department of Technology and Justice Studies. The School of Arts and Sciences will include the Department of Biology, Department of Communications, Department of English and Humanities, Department of Fine Arts, Department of History and Political Sciences, Department of Mathematics and Physical Sciences, and Department of Psychology and Sociology. (June)

Rogers State Recommended for Full, Active NCAA Division II Membership. RSU in July announced it has been confirmed for full National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II membership. The membership change will take effect Sept. 1. At that time, the Hillcats will be eligible, for the first time, to compete in NCAA-sanctioned Division II athletics postseason competition after concluding the three-year membership process. University officials deemed the move to the NCAA Division II model as a better fit for the university with its emphasis on academic achievement, personal development, and commitment to improving their communities. (June)

U.S. News Recognizes RSU for Low Student Debt, Diversity. RSU was recognized among the region's top schools for lowest student debt upon graduation and most ethnically diverse student bodies, according to U.S. News & World Report's Best Colleges annual survey. This is the fourth consecutive year U.S. News' Best Colleges has recognized RSU for having graduates with low student debt when compared to regional peers. The annual report noted almost half (49 percent) of RSU's 2013 graduating class earned a diploma without student debt, which was the most among western regional colleges. For those who did assume student debt, RSU graduates had the second-lowest average debt of \$13,403 when compared with western regional college peers. U.S. News also noted RSU is among the region's most ethnically diverse schools with 18 percent of RSU students self-reporting as multiracial, or being from two or more races. Additionally, about 13 percent of RSU's student population report they are solely Native American, according to university reports. (October)

RSU Makes Graduate Education More Accessible. RSU has adjusted its MBA degree to make it more efficient for working professionals, allowing students to earn a graduate degree in as little as 18 months. University officials have implemented a three-tiered strategy to streamline the process of beginning and finishing an MBA, even for those students who enter the program without a business background. Starting in January, all MBA courses will be offered in an eight-week format, which will allow students to complete coursework in an accelerated timeframe. The changes are designed to meet the needs of students, especially for working professionals. (November)

RSU Receives Largest Gift from an Individual to Establish Scholarship Endowments. RSU students have two new scholarship opportunities thanks to the legacy of Oklahoma Military Academy distinguished alumnus Jack Harris, who established a trust to provide funds for the establishment of two scholarship endowments prior to his death in November. He attended OMA, RSU's predecessor, from 1951 until 1955. The endowments are the single largest gift from an individual in RSU's history. The Allie L. Harris and Jack E. Harris Scholarship Endowment and the C. Earl Harris and Irene Harris Scholarship Endowment will become available to students next fall. Each scholarship gives first preference to students with majors in the School of Business and Technology and second preference to students with majors in the Schools of Mathematics, Science and Health Sciences. While the first scholarship honors the memory of Harris and his wife, the second honors the life and memory of Harris's parents, whom he credited with supporting his decision to attend OMA. (January)

RSU Receives Historic \$2 Million Pledge for Honors Program, Campus Buildings. The largest individual, charitable pledge in RSU's history will provide enhancements and scholarships for its Honors Program, with additional funds being used for continued maintenance of campus buildings. The \$2.06 million pledge is scheduled to be fulfilled in payments over 10 years with a final lump sum to be provided at a future date. The gift, coordinated through the RSU Foundation, is restricted to campus building maintenance and the RSU's Honors Program, including scholarships and program enhancements. (February)

RSU Academic Programs Earn National Honors.

- RSU was named among the nation's top online business programs by College Choice, an independent college search and rankings website. RSU was ranked 41st among the top fifty online bachelor's programs for business in the United States based on factors such as cost of attendance, each program's reputation in its field, and return on investment. (May)
- RSU's bachelor degree in justice administration has been ranked among the nation's 50 Best Value Colleges for a Criminal Justice Degree 2015 by BestValueSchools.com. The bachelor's degree in justice administration was ranked 11th in BestValueSchool.com's national survey of criminal justice degrees. The report noted the degree's rigorous graduation requirements help students learn about crime, equal justice, the American court system, Native American law, data analysis and more. RSU was the only school from Oklahoma ranked in the report. (August)
- AffordableCollegesOnline.org named Rogers State University's business information technology degree program as Oklahoma's top-ranked computer science program. The 2015-16 Best Online Computer Science Programs report included RSU as the only Oklahoma school and 32nd of 40 computer science degree programs recognized by the website. The report said RSU students are prepared for a career in information systems through its business information technology degree program, which includes specializations in either computer network administration, or software development and multimedia. (October)

Faculty Awards & News.

- Dr. Frank W. Elwell, longtime dean of the School of Liberal Arts, will return to full-time faculty status starting August 1. Dr. Elwell was named the founding dean of the School of Liberal Arts in June 2000 as the university began its transition from a two-year to a four-year institution. (May)
- MIT Press released "Off-Track and Offline" by Dr. Holly Kruse, RSU Associate Professor of Communications. Her book examines the prevalence of communication systems that originated from the horse racing industry. (May)
- The Marine Corps Heritage Foundation honored Dr. David J. Ulbrich, RSU assistant professor in the Department of History and Political Science, with its 2016 Colonel Robert D. Heintz Prize for the most outstanding article on Marine Corps history and life published during the past year. (May)

- Three RSU history professors joined soldiers from the U.S. Army Engineer School on a staff ride to the Shiloh battlefield where soldiers researched and played the roles of key combatants during the important Civil War battle. The U.S. Army has conducted Staff Rides all over the world for more than a century. RSU Professors Dr. Jane Johansson, Dr. Paul Hatley and Dr. David Ulbrich met in Tennessee with a group of soldiers led by the Engineer School's Commandant and Brigadier General James Raymer for the staff ride. Commanders, warrant officers, and senior noncommissioned officers of the Engineer School and the 1st Engineer Brigade participated in the staff ride. (June)

Hundreds Volunteer as Part of RSU's MLK Week of Service. One of the largest community service events of its kind in the region, RSU's Martin Luther King Jr. Week of Service was held on campus and in the community from Jan. 18-22. Several hundred students, faculty and staff volunteered at community sites throughout the region throughout the week, including a service day on Friday, Jan. 22. Additionally, approximately 200 students and community members attended the Jan. 19 MLK Commemorative Ceremony and Concert featuring traditional and original works honoring the slain civil rights leader. (January)

RSU TV Premieres Nationally Distributed Will Rogers Documentary. RSU TV is the presenting station for the national broadcast distribution of the new documentary, "The Verdigris: In Search of Will Rogers." More than 60 public television licensees have already signed on to broadcast the title through the American Public Television network. The documentary, which premiered on Jan. 7 on RSU TV, traces Rogers' life through the eyes of Oklahoma songwriter Beau Jennings. (January)

Honors Students Organize Success Series. Two RSU seniors have organized a campus speaker series that allows fellow students to learn from and network with successful entrepreneurs and notable business and nonprofit leaders in Oklahoma. After returning from the prestigious Washington Center internship program earlier this year, students Edgar Zetina and Seth Blanton began planning a speaker series that would give RSU students similar opportunities to hear directly from inspiring Oklahomans. They hope the Success Series will help students be more prepared to enter the workforce and show how students can succeed in Oklahoma. (November)

Freshman Named 2016 Newman Civic Fellow. An RSU freshman was among 218 college students nationwide to be named a 2016 Newman Civic Fellow in recognition for her service to the local community. Katelyn Gamble, a business administration-accounting major from Edmond, is a member of the RSU Hillcats softball team and the President's Leadership Class at RSU. Students selected as a Newman Civic Fellow have demonstrated they are seeking to better understand themselves, the root causes of social issues, and effective mechanisms for creating lasting change. (April)

Communications Students, Faculty Win Statewide Awards. Five students from the RSU Department of Communications earned top awards during the annual Oklahoma Association of Broadcasters convention. OAB also awarded a \$2,000 scholarship to RSU junior Geoff Parachin, marking the tenth time in 12 years that an RSU student has earned one of the six competitive scholarships open to all Oklahoma communication students. RSU communications faculty member Cathy Coomer was awarded the competitive 2016 Lisa John Fellowship, which includes a \$3,000 award and places an Oklahoma faculty member in a four-week work program at an Oklahoma radio or television station. (April)

RSU Pryor to Host New Summer Academy. RSU Pryor will host two new aerospace-themed academies this summer thanks to a grant from the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. AeroCamp Summer Academy will challenge students 8th through 11th grade to learn about science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) concepts by working hands-on with aerospace-related devices. OSRHE's 2016 Summer Academies Program provided an \$18,000 grant for the camps, which will allow them to be free for participating students. The two five-day academies will give students the theory, skills and application they need to compete on an accelerated level. (February)

ART Academy Introduces Low-Income Students to Robotics and Higher Education. Several junior high and high school students worked with robotics for the first time during the third annual Appreciating Real-World Technology (ART) Academy at RSU this summer. The ART Academy, a week-long residential camp for low-income youth, offers junior and high school students a hands-on classroom experience in a college environment. The camp's goal is to help youth to encounter a fun college environment with a variety of diverse learning experiences. A total of 19 students from twelve Oklahoma cities attended ART Academy. (June)

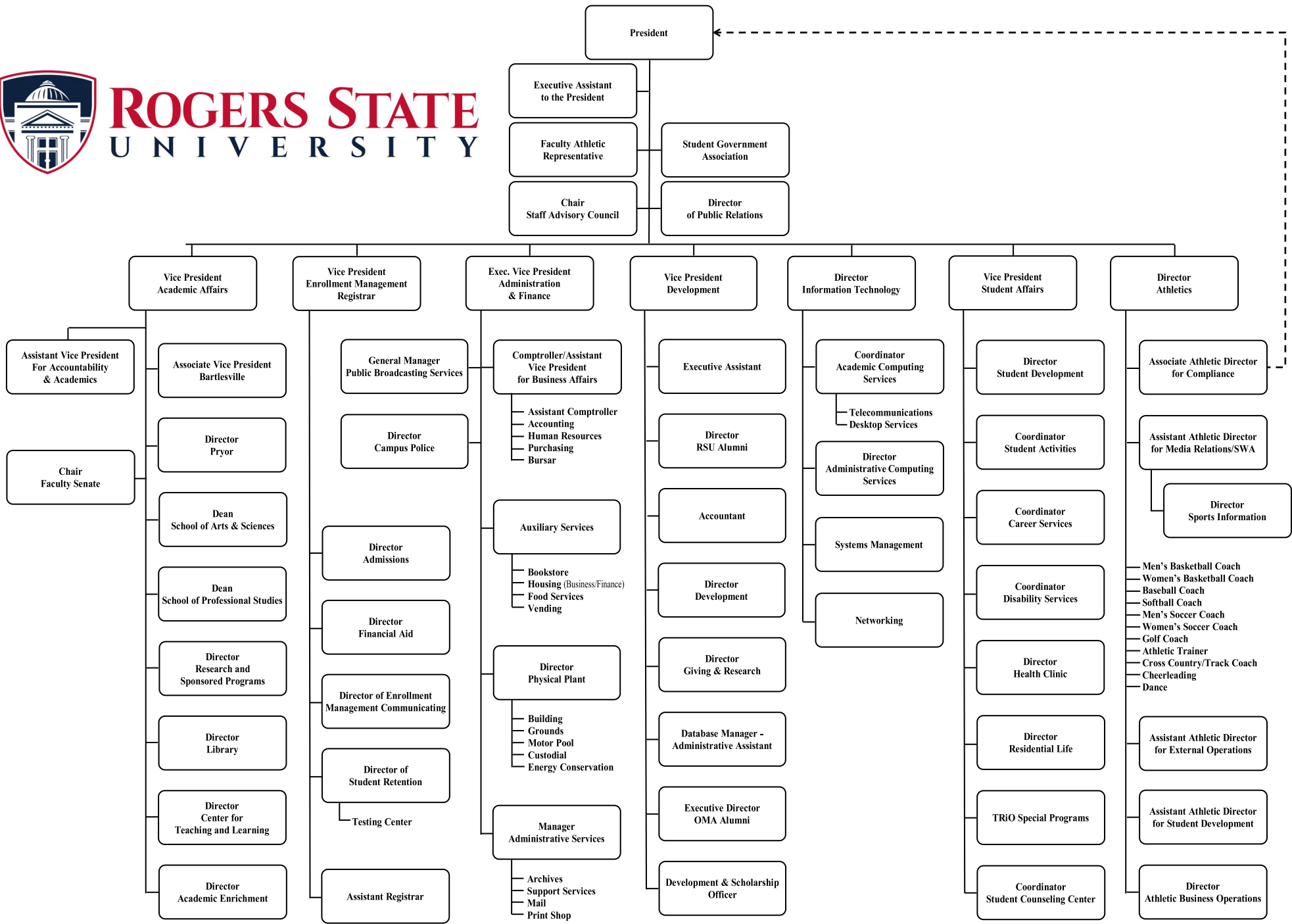
Federal Judge Delivered RSU's Meyer Lecture. Distinguished jurist Darnell Jones, II, U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, presented his remarks entitled "Diversity Then and Now: What Have We Learned?" during RSU's Maurice Meyer Distinguished Endowed Lecture in October. Jones was sworn in as a judge of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania after nomination by President George W. Bush in 2008. A 1968 graduate of Claremore High School, Jones was inducted into the Claremore Public Schools Foundation's Hall of Fame in 1995. (October)

Former Army Chief of Staff Receives RSU Constitution Award. Former U.S. Army Chief of Staff General Dennis J. Reimer, United States Army (Retired), received the RSU Constitution Award during a Nov. 9 ceremony and luncheon on the Claremore campus. The highest ranking military officer born in Oklahoma, General Reimer grew up in Medford, Oklahoma, and he held numerous command positions during his 37 years of active service, culminating in his service on the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Each fall since 1987, RSU has presented the Constitution Award to an Oklahoman who has demonstrated a strong commitment to the principles of the U.S. Constitution through his or her life's work. (November)

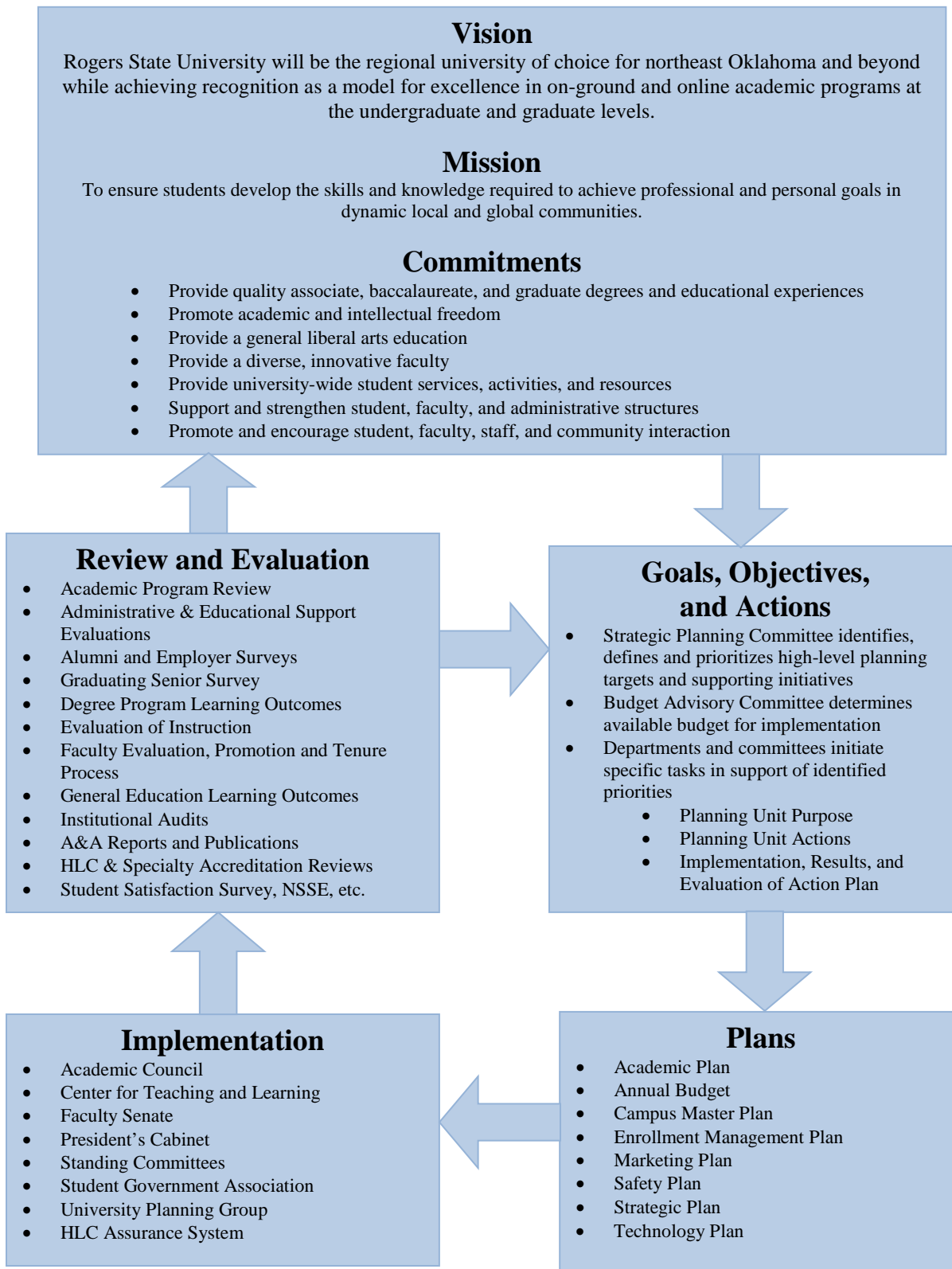

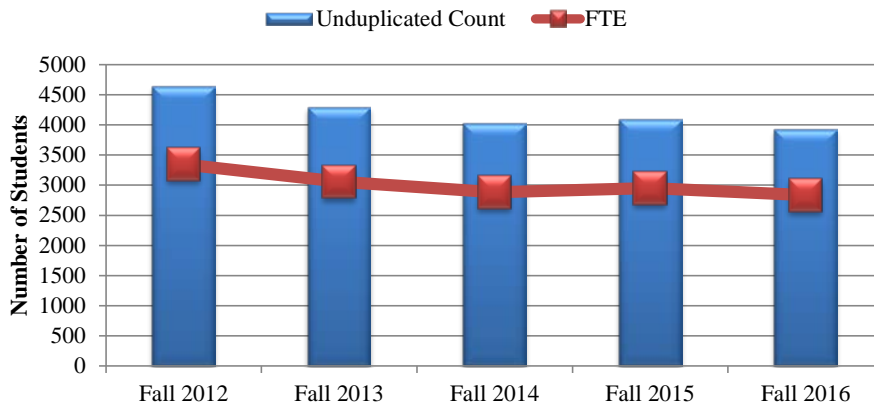

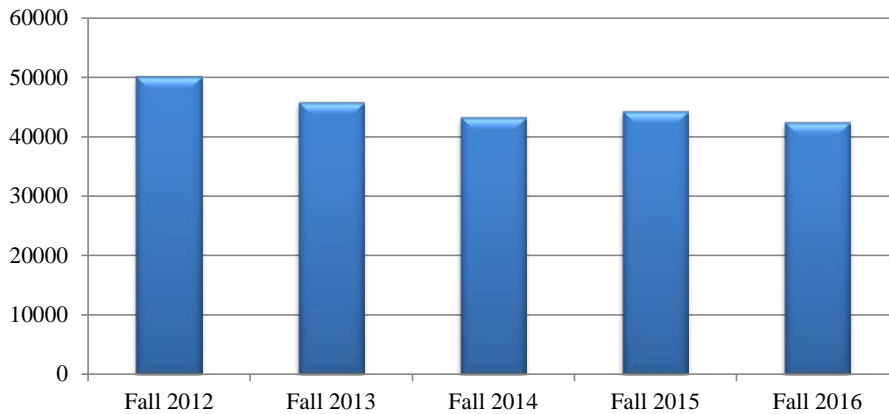


**Unduplicated Headcount and FTE
(Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)**



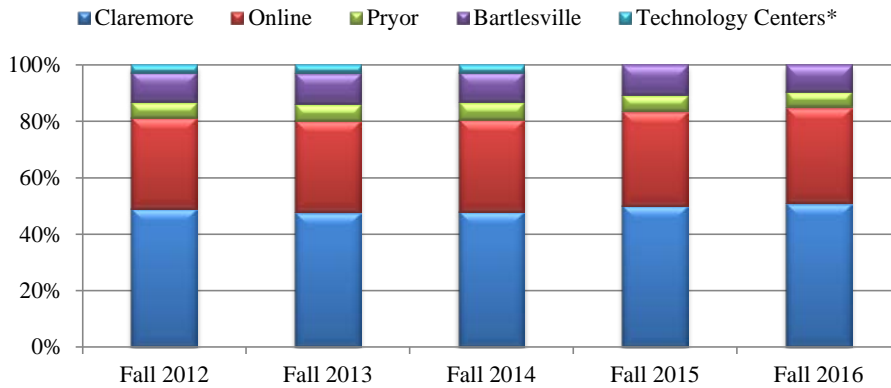

(Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)**



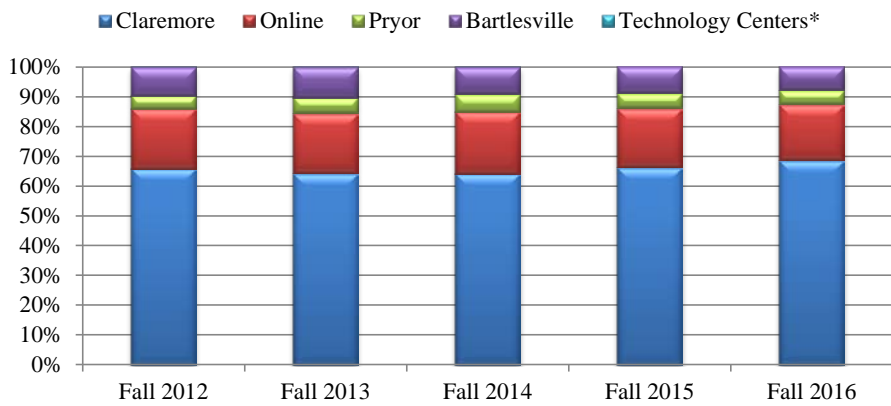

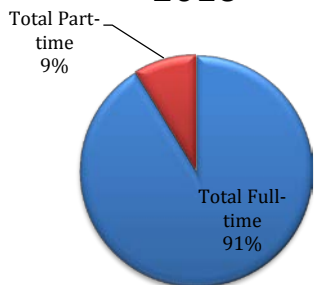

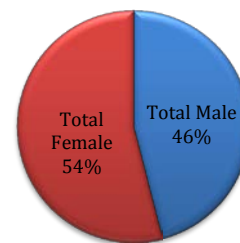

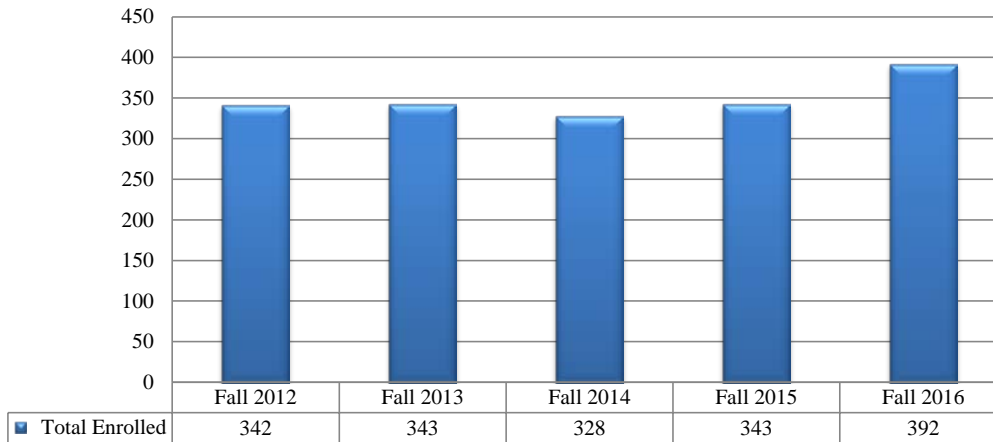

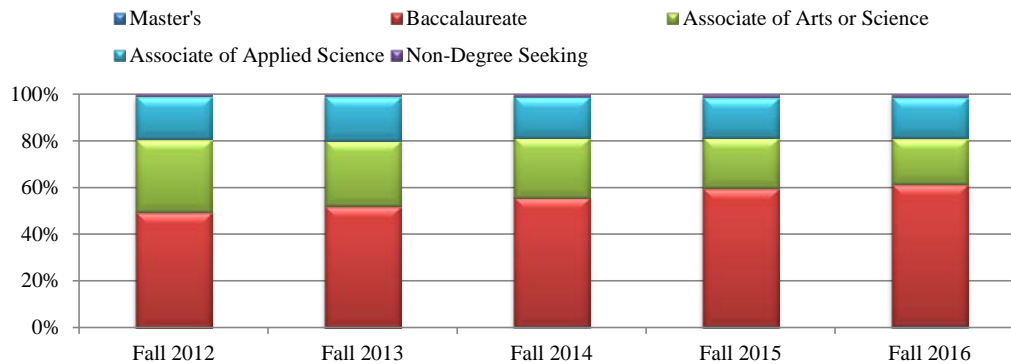

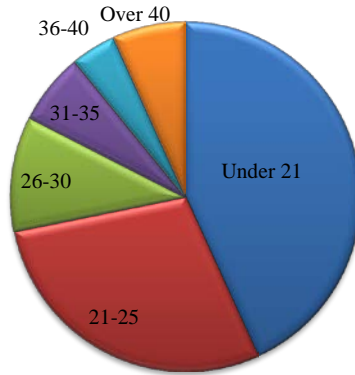


Unduplicated Headcount by Goal

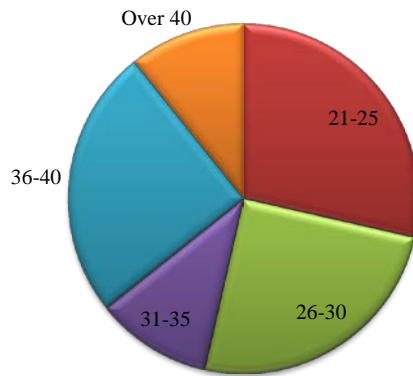
Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Undergraduate

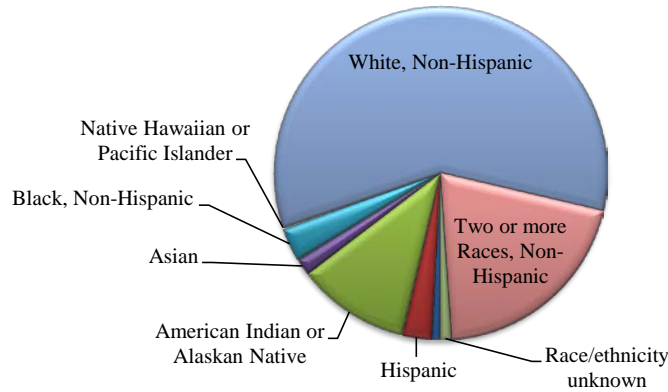
Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Graduate

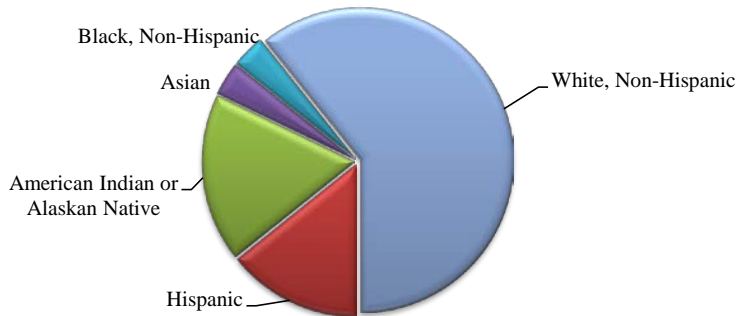

Unduplicated Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Undergraduate



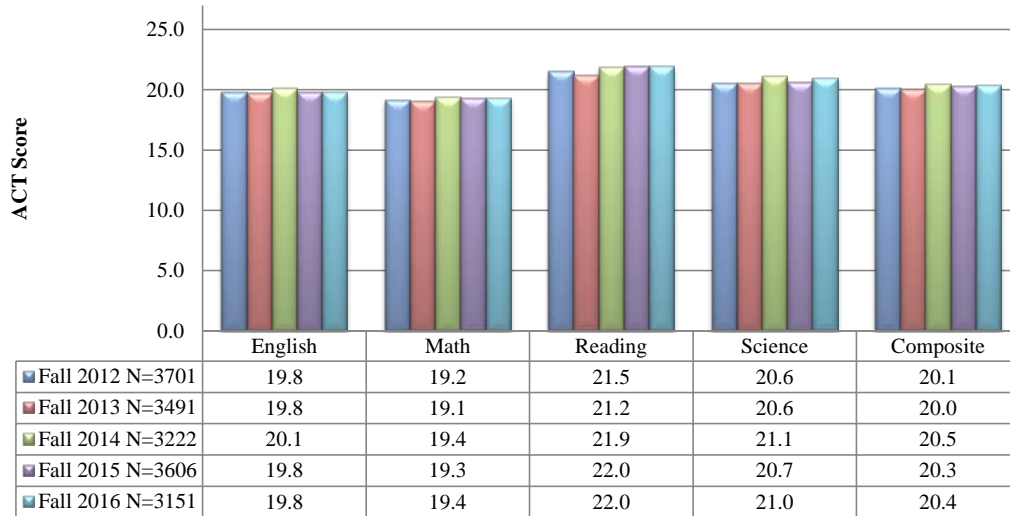

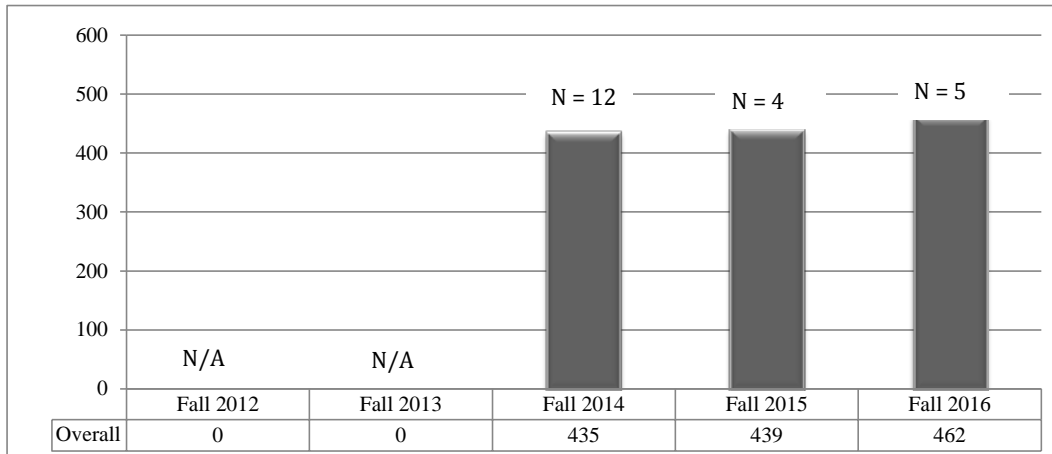

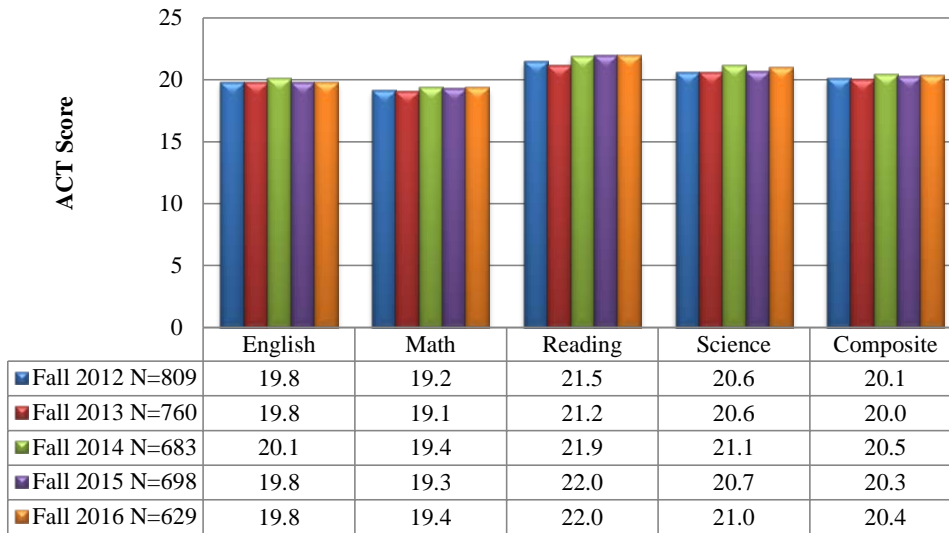

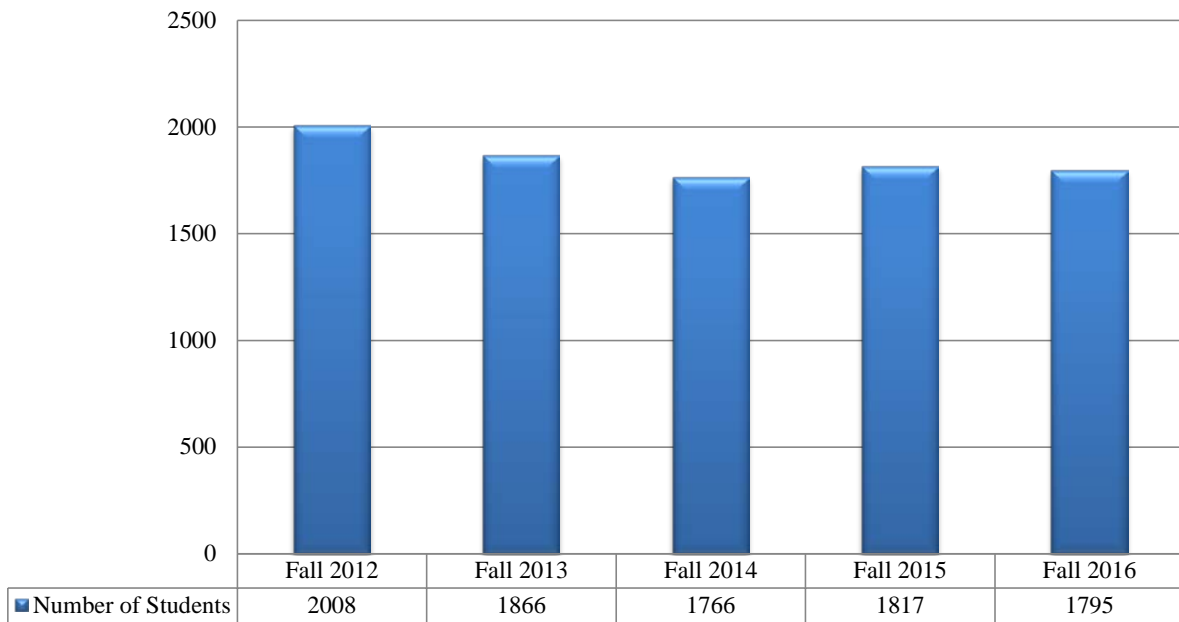
First-time Transfers Headcount



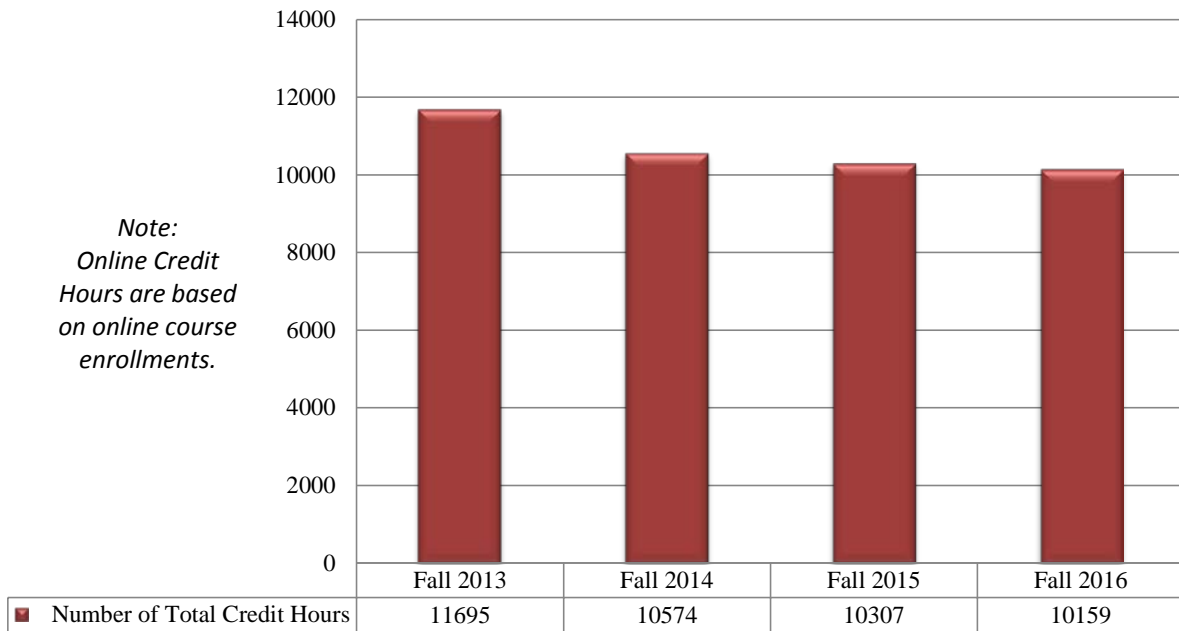

Full-time Faculty by Rank

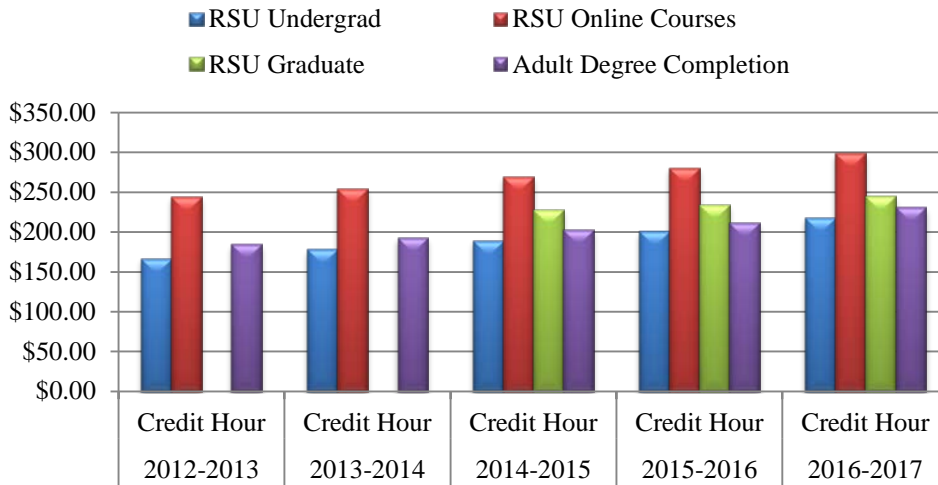

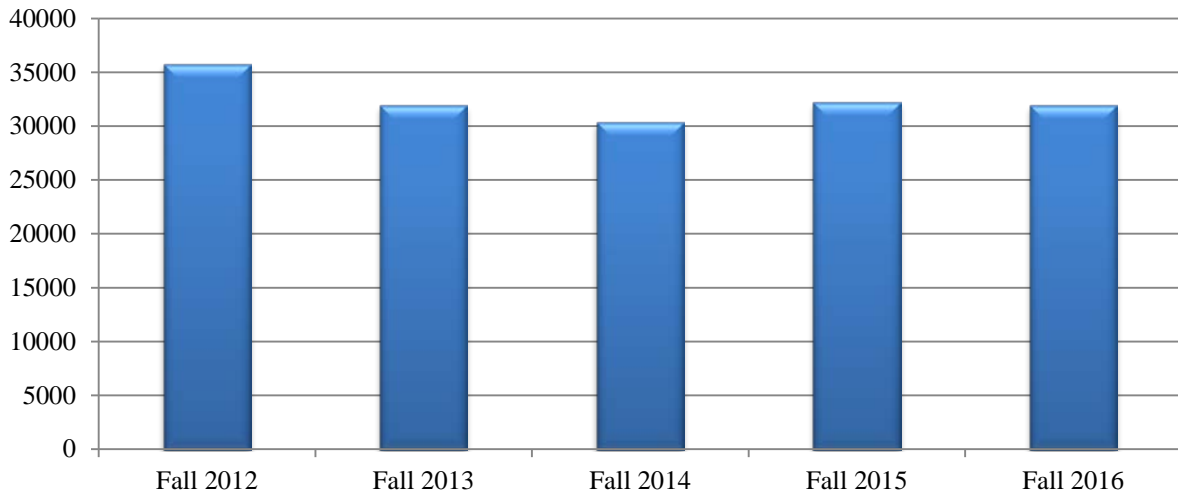

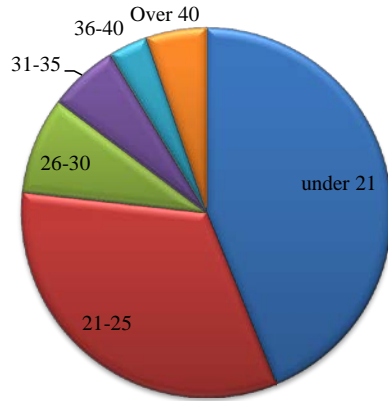


Claremore Headcount by Goal



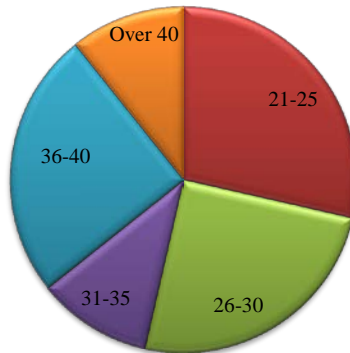

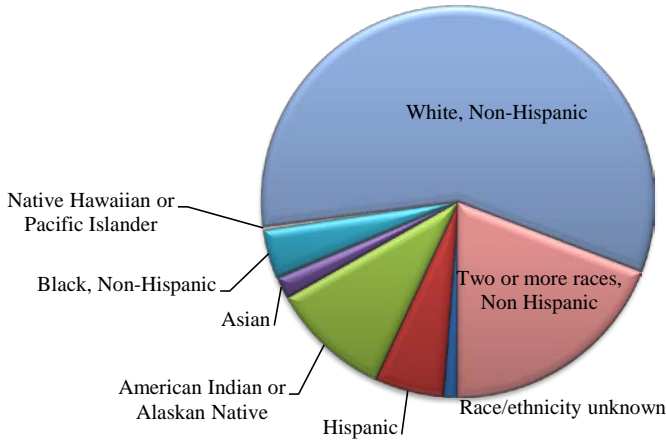

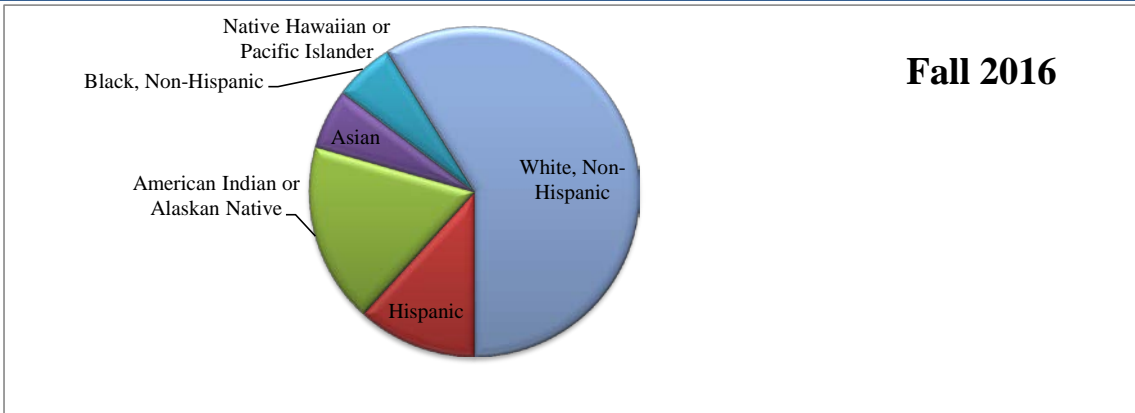

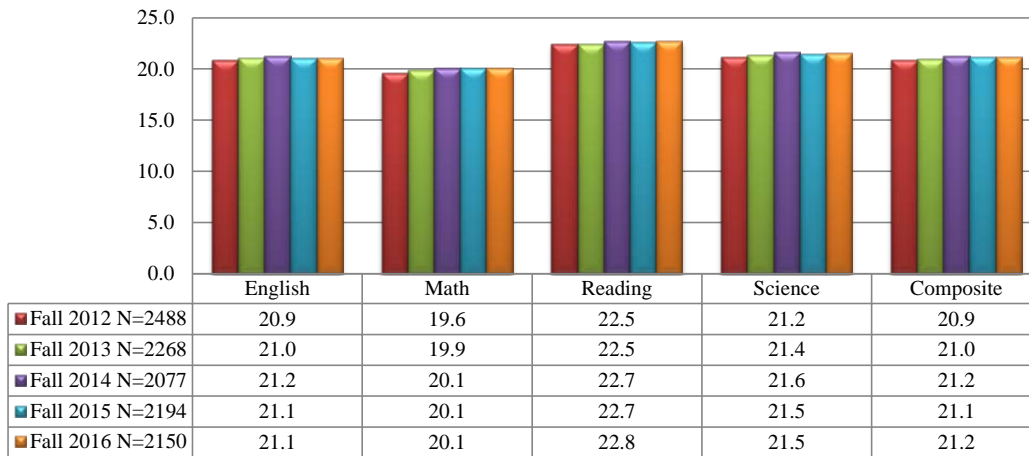

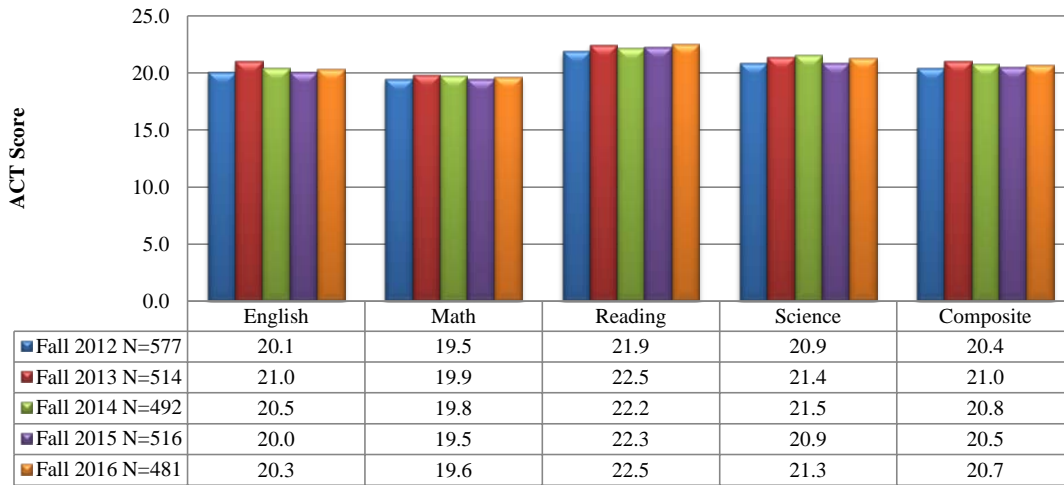

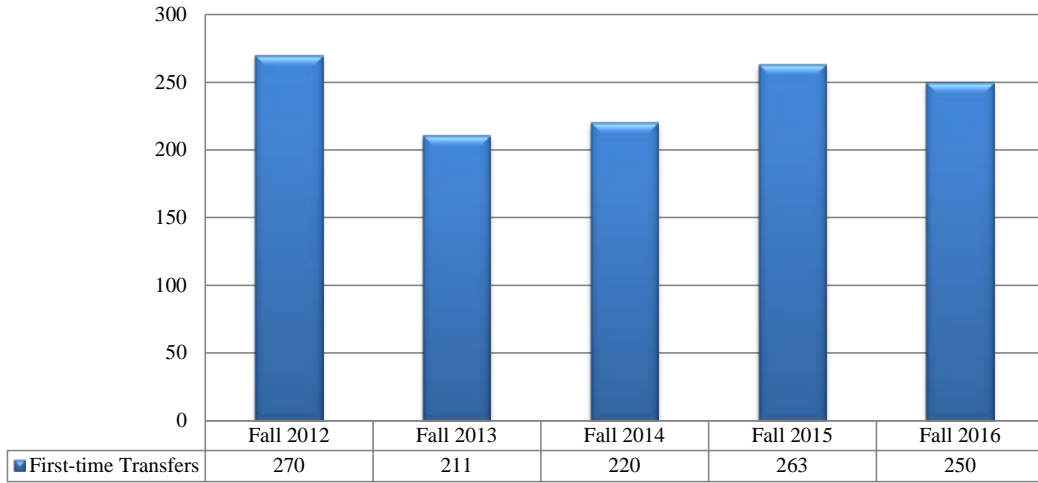
Average ACT for Claremore Students Who Submitted Scores

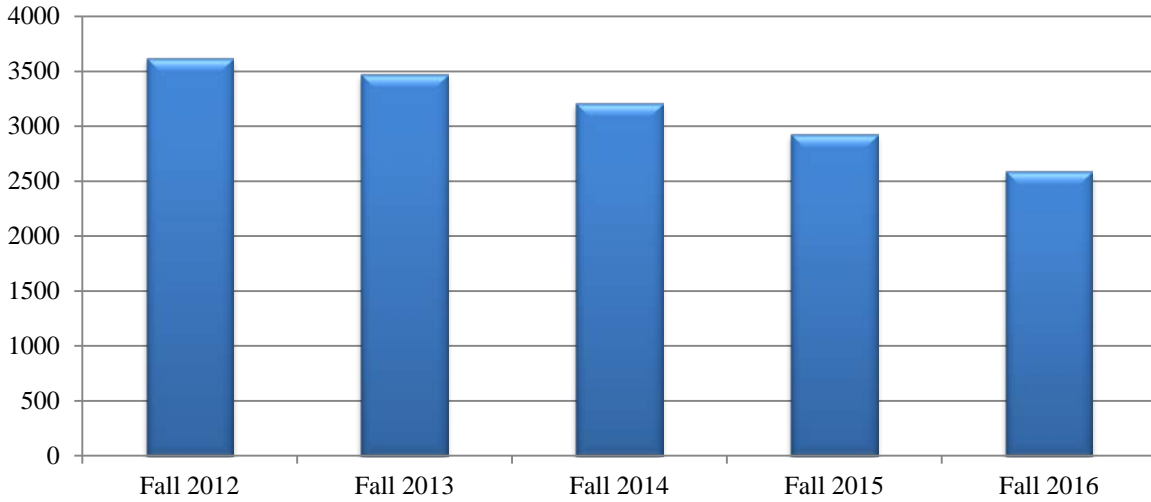

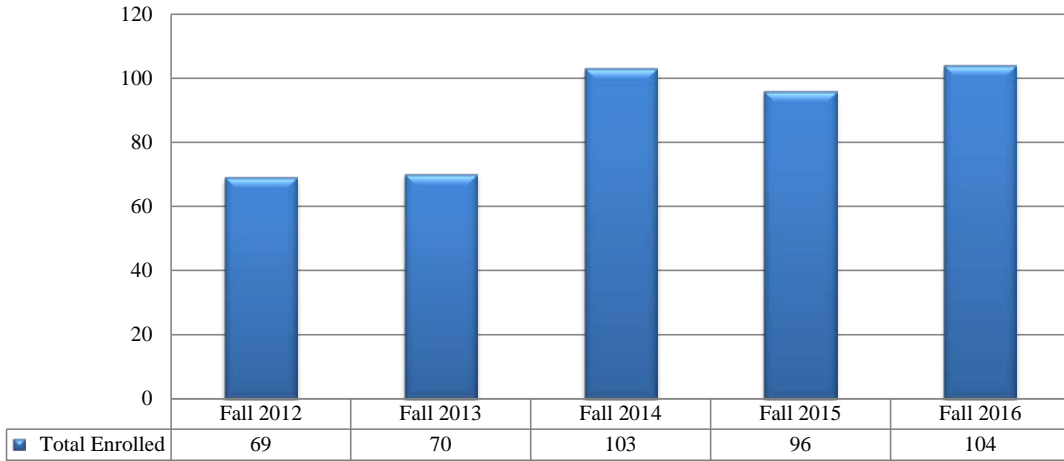

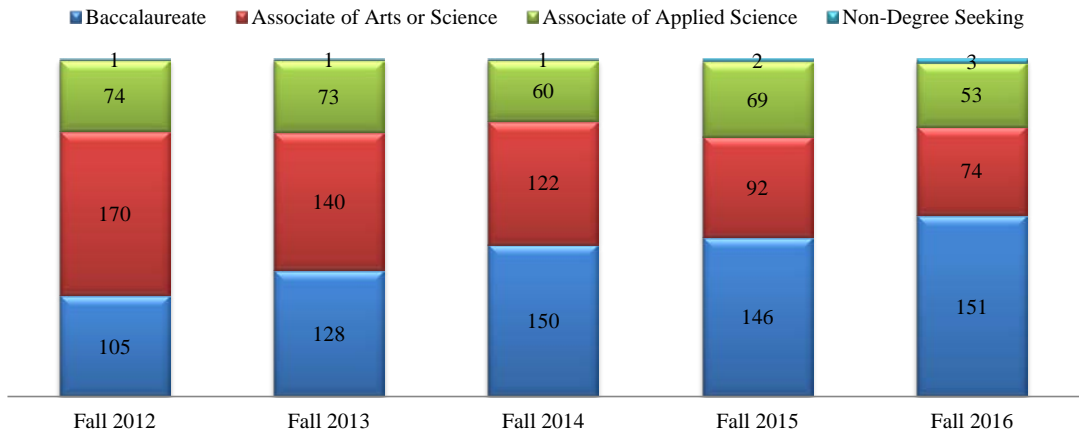

Pryor Concurrent High School Student Headcount

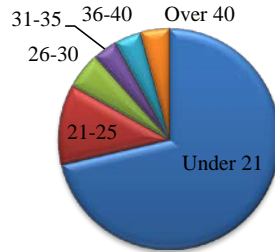


Pryor Headcount by Goal

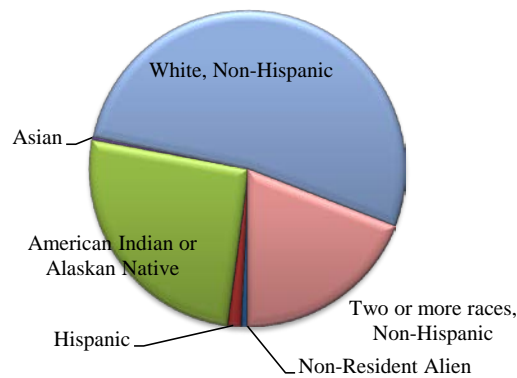
Pryor Headcount by Age

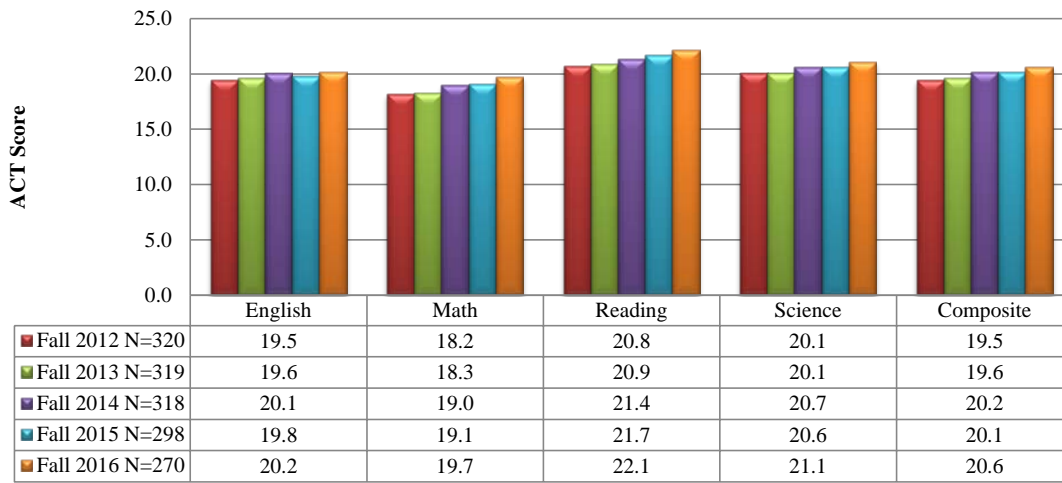
Pryor Headcount by Race/Ethnicity



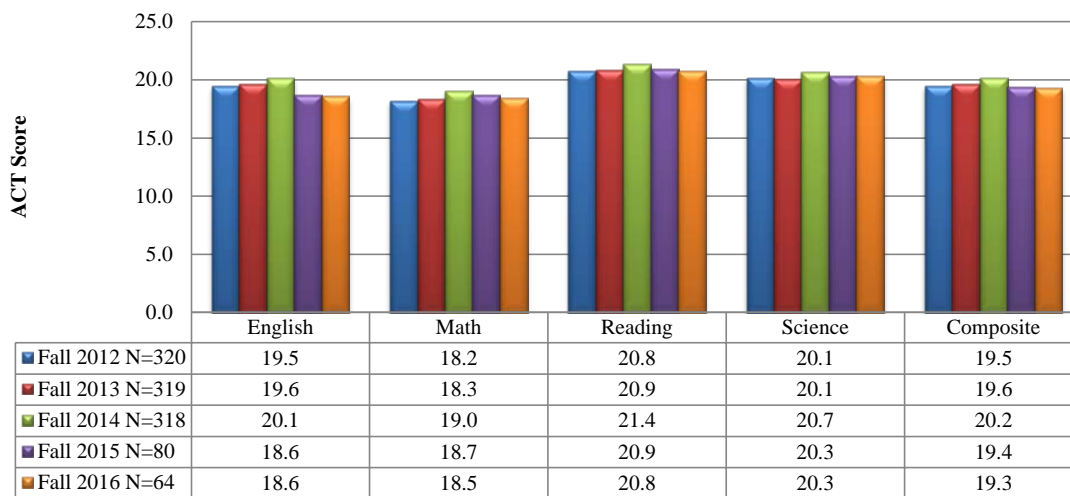

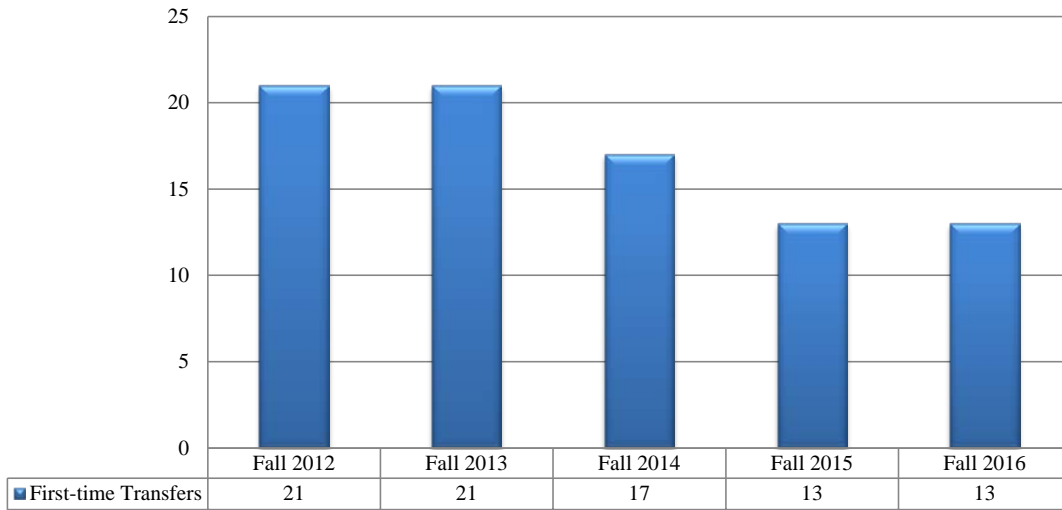
Average ACT for Pryor Students Who Submitted Scores

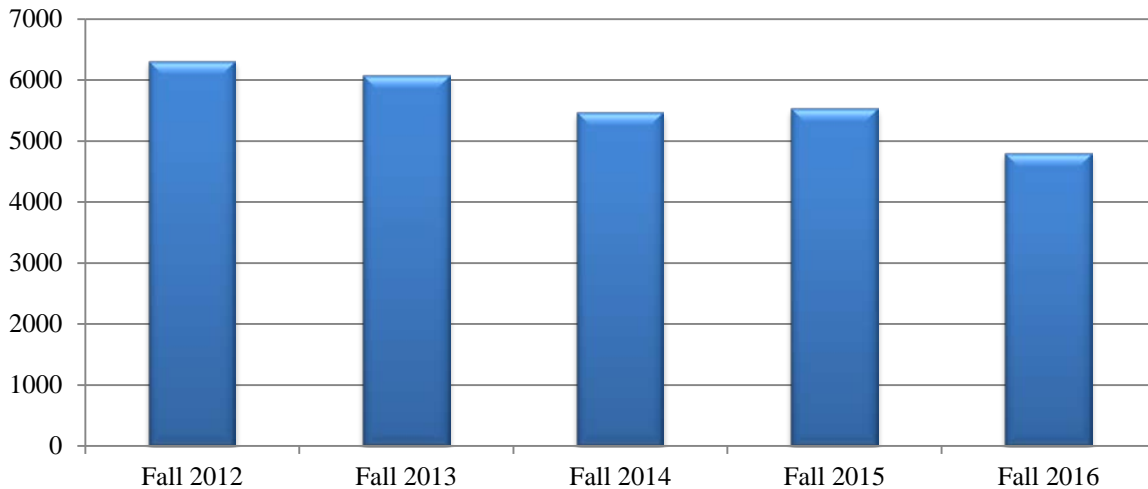

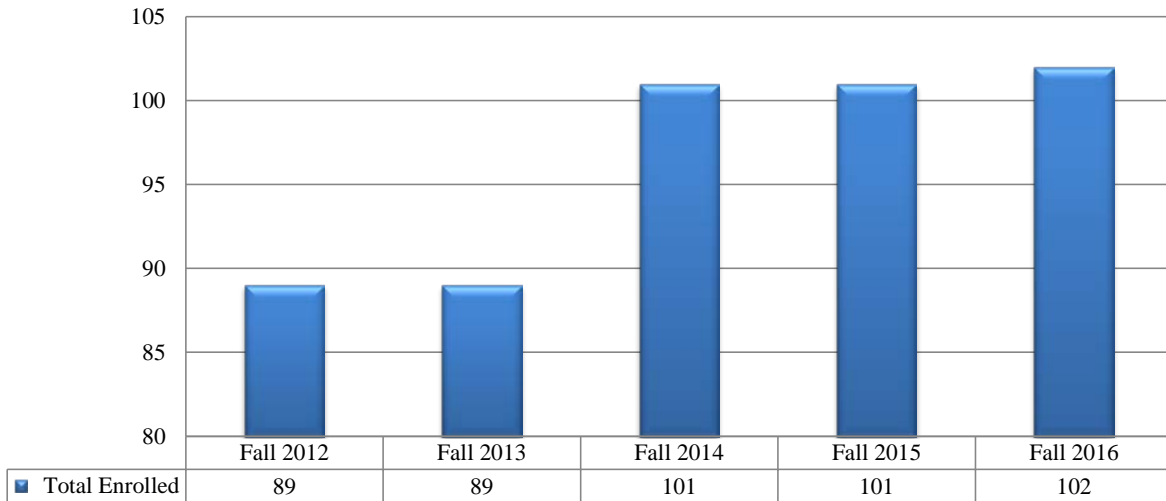

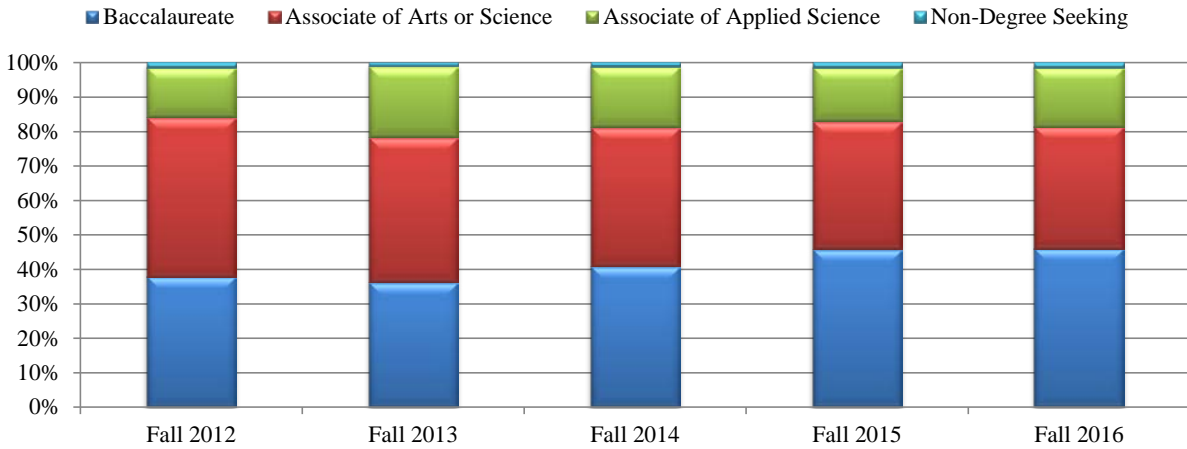

Bartlesville Concurrent High School Student Headcount

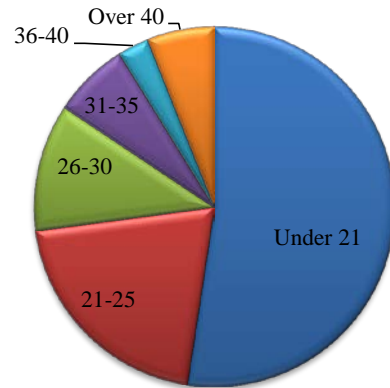


Bartlesville Headcount by Goal

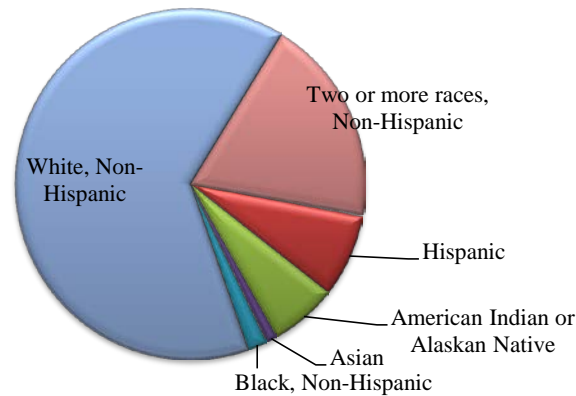
Bartlesville Headcount by Age

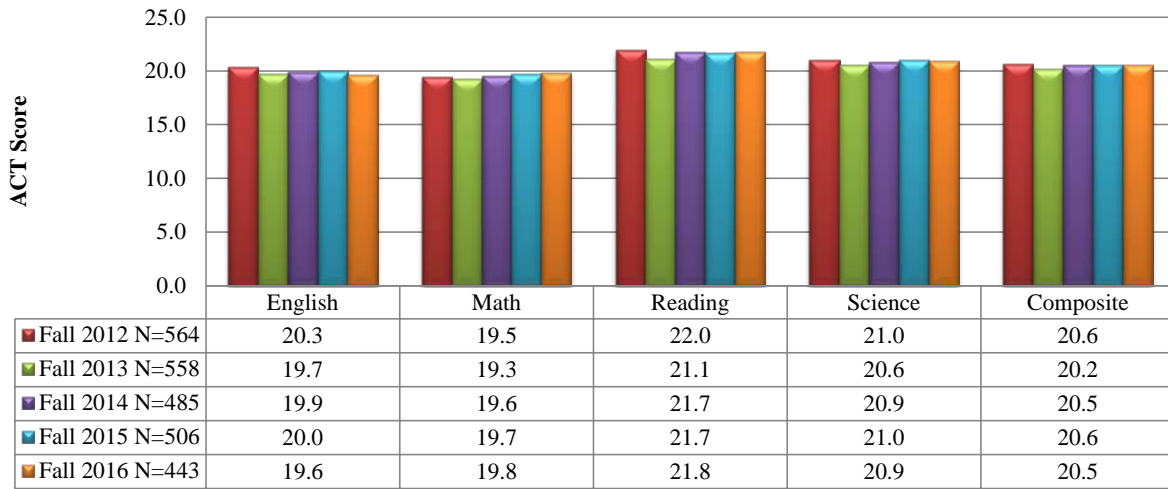
Bartlesville Headcount by Race/Ethnicity



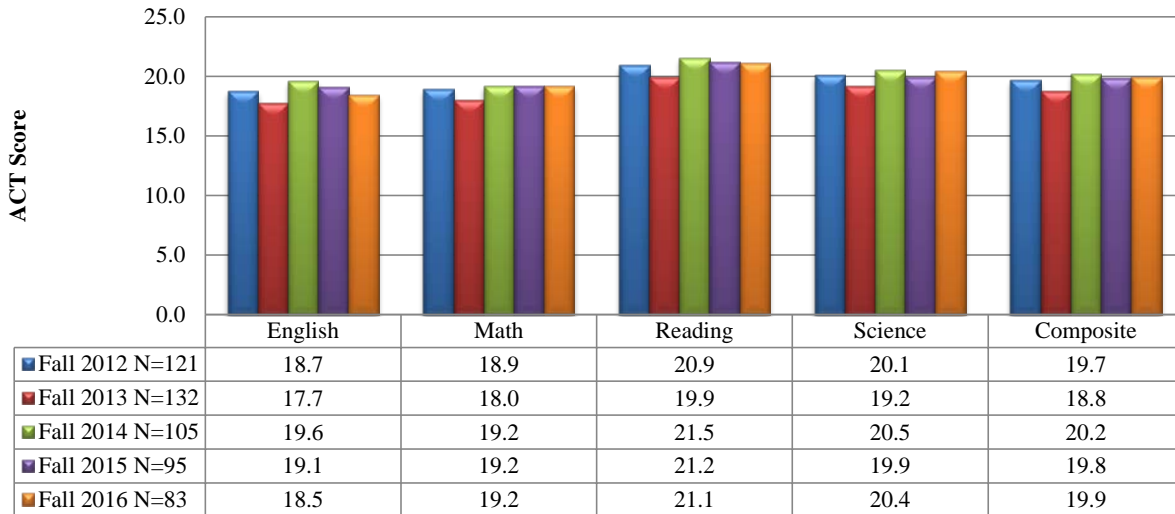

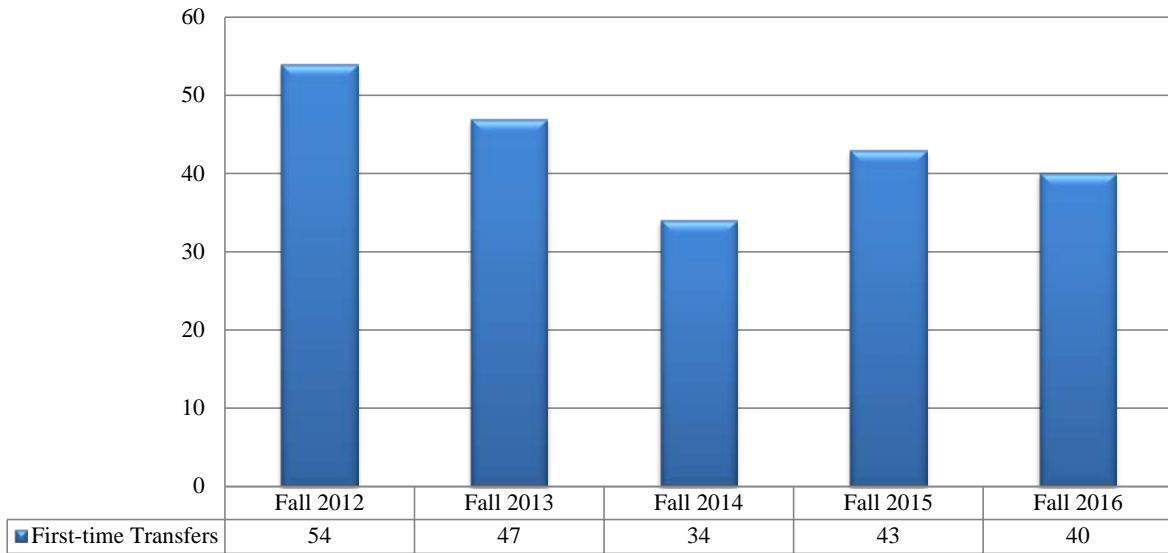
Average ACT for Bartlesville Students Who Submitted Scores

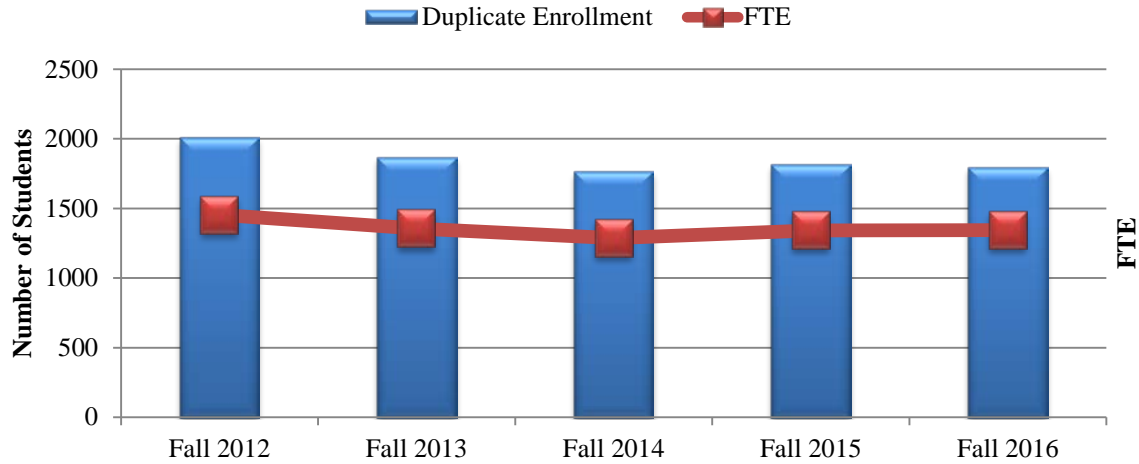

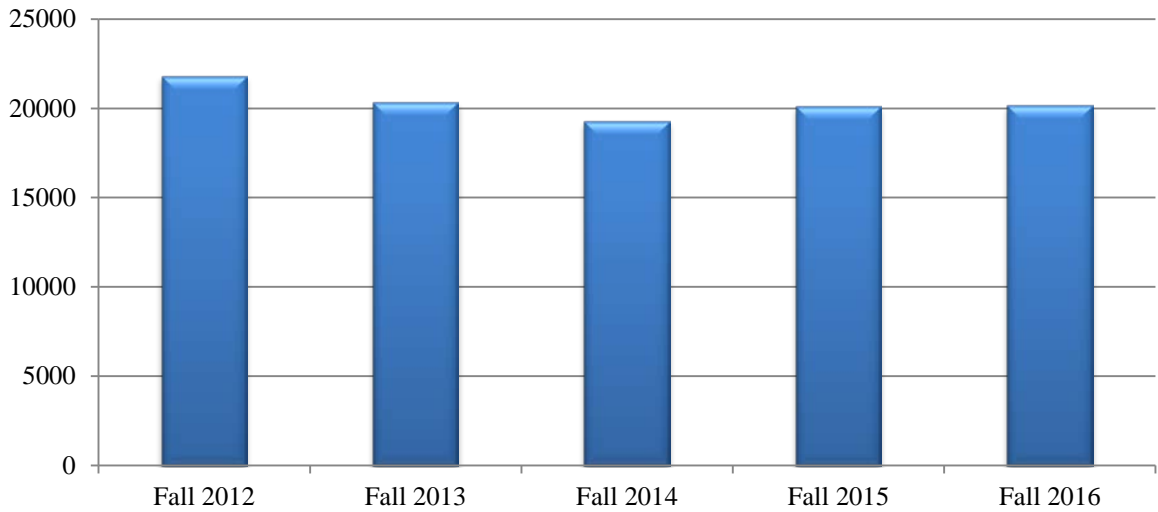

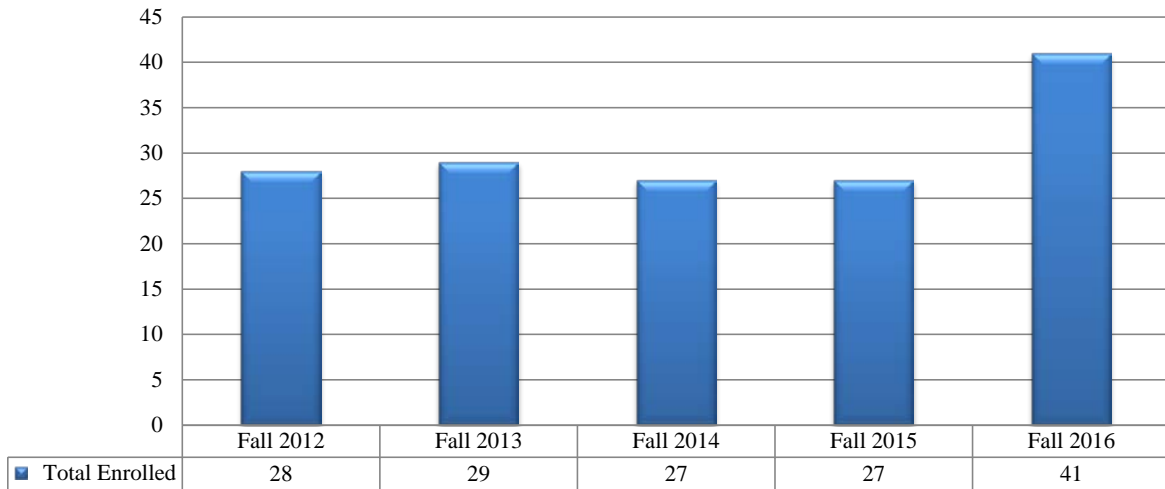

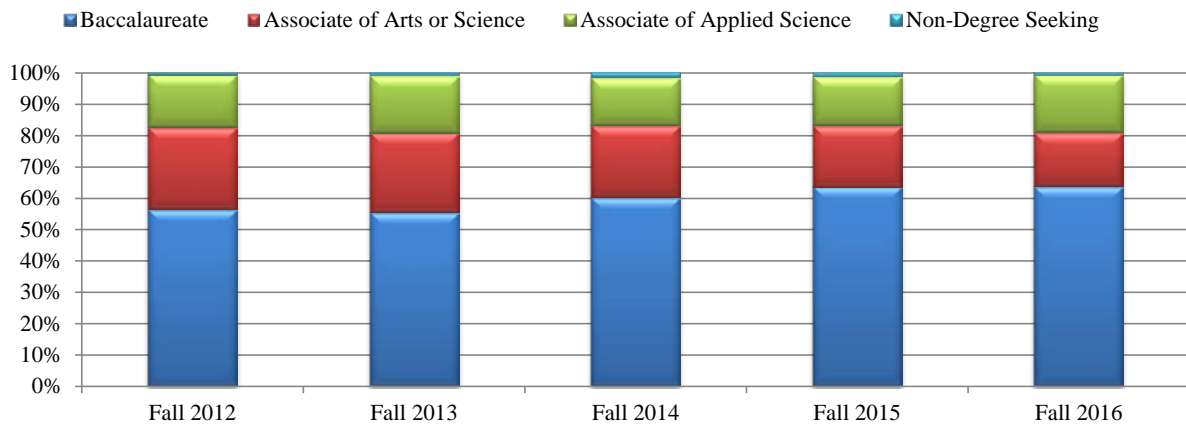

Online Concurrent High School Student Headcount



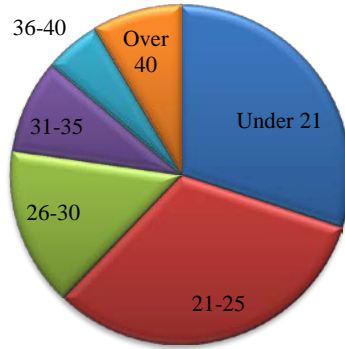

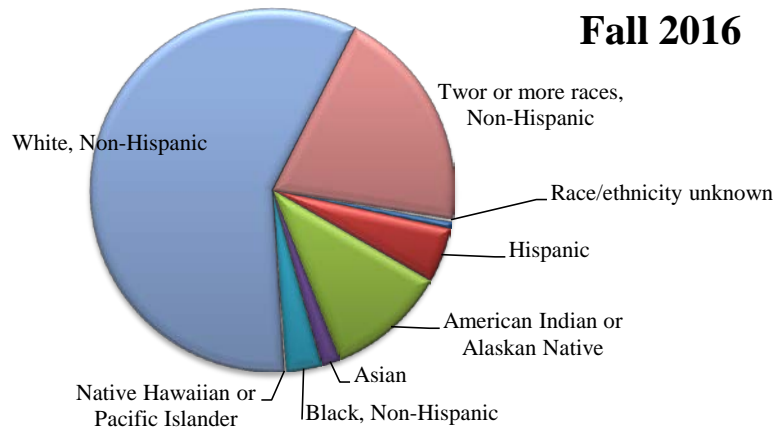

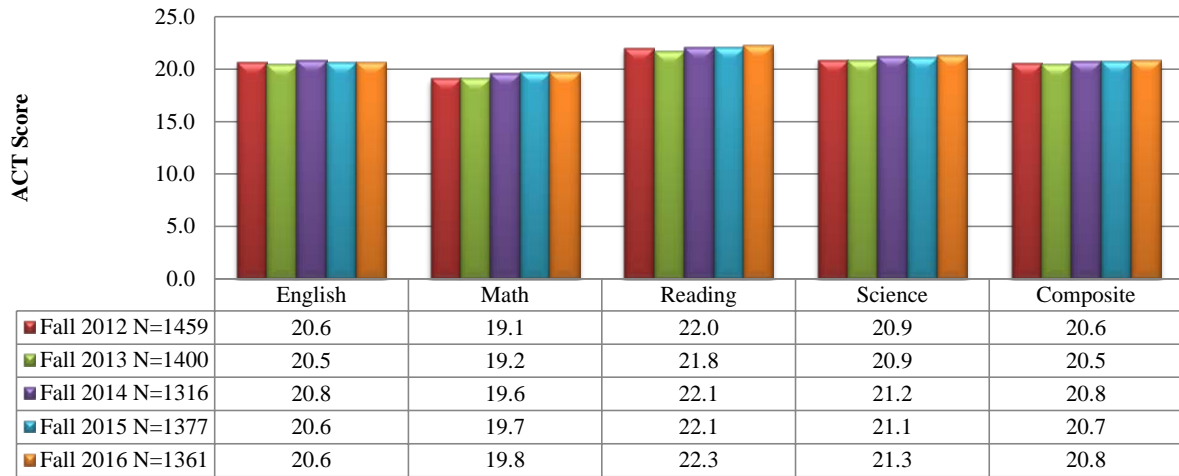

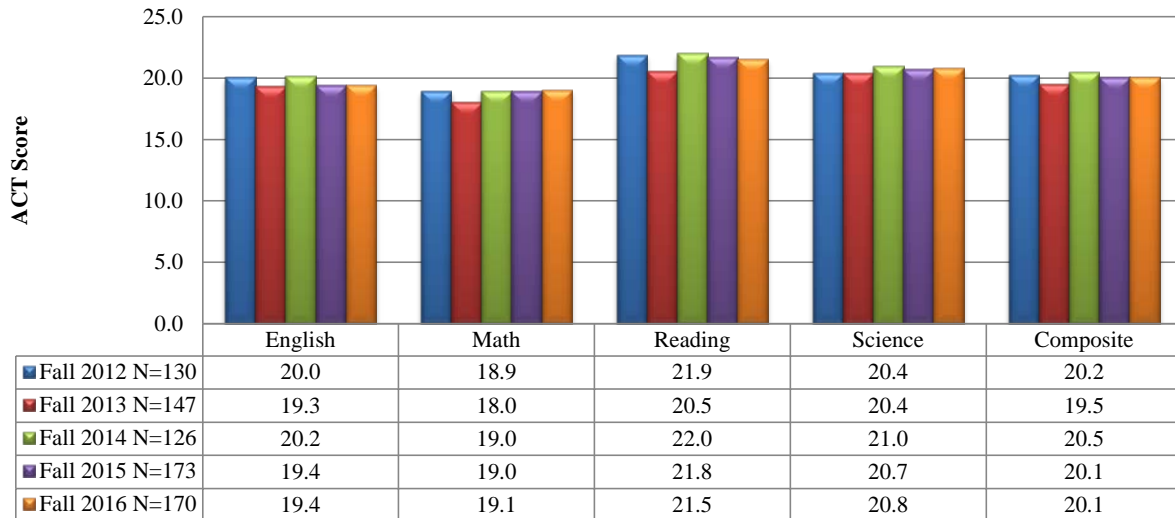

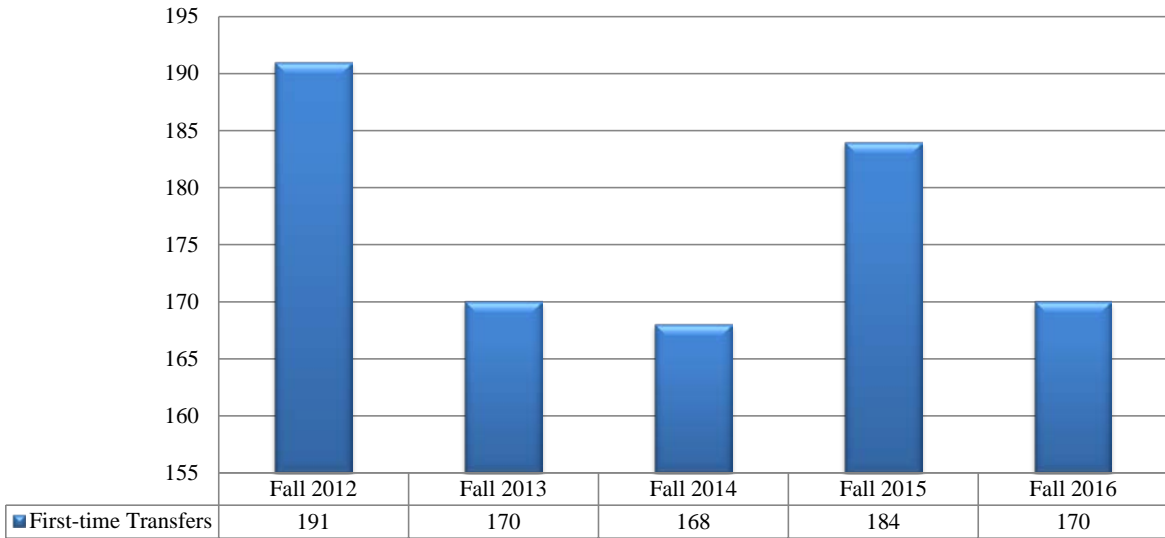
Average ACT for Online Students Who Submitted Scores

Glossary of Terms

- **Credit (Semester) Hour**—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- **Audit**—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for “audit” enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- **Unduplicated Count**—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- **Site**—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- **Classification**
 - **Freshman**—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
 - **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
 - **Junior**—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
 - **Senior**—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college or who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F’s, and excluding W’s and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **Concurrent High School Student**— A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- **Non-Degree Seeking**—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

Glossary of Funding Terms

- **E & G 1**—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- **E & G 2**—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- **Auxiliary**—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- **Capital**—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- **Academic Support**—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- **Institutional Support**—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Plant**—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
