RSU Major Considerations: Liberal Arts

If your CCC major is **Art** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art**, all "Recommended Courses" listed for your CCC major will transfer to the BFA.

If your CCC major is **Communications** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Arts in Communications**, the following elective courses in your CCC major are recommended: COMM-101 Introduction to Mass Communications, COMM-260 TV Production Practice I, COMM-261 Broadcast Operations, COMM-230 Digital Editing, and COMM-211 Video Production Applications. Such courses as COMM-235 Streaming Media for the Web, COMM-225 Digital Photography, and COMM-255 Practical Applications of Graphic Communications are appropriate courses for a Graphic Design Minor.

If your CCC major is **English** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts Degree with an English Option**, all "Recommended Courses" in your CCC major will transfer. Foreign language credit will also transfer to RSU as part of both general education credit (Global Studies) and Program credit.

If your CCC major is **History** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Social Science (BSSS) Degree with a History Option,** all the "Recommended History Courses" in your CCC major will transfer to the program or to needed general education. Additional electives that will transfer into the program include HIST-103 Recent United States History, HIST-230 World Civilizations I (also as general education Global Studies), HIST-240 Native American History (also as general education Global Studies).

If your CCC major is **Humanities** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts Degree with a Humanities Option**, the following elective courses in your CCC major are recommended: HUMN 104 Introduction to Philosophy, HUMN-125 Humanities I, HUMN-135 Humanities II, and HUMN-180 Introduction to Ethics. In addition, HUMN-208 World Religions is a general education elective in Global Studies, and HUMN-130 History and Development of Motion Pictures is a general education elective in Humanities. Foreign language credit will also transfer to RSU as part of both general education credit (Global Studies) and Program credit.

If your CCC major is **Political Science** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Social Science (BSSS) Degree with a Political Science Option,** the following courses in your CCC major would count toward general education electives: HIST-102 Early United States History (History Elective), ECON 205 Principles of Macroeconomics (Social Science Elective), ECON-206 Principles of Microeconomics (Social Science Elective), HIST-103 (History Elective), GOVN-104 United States Government (American Government Requirement), and GEOG-120 World Geography (Global Studies Elective). NALS-180 would be counted toward a Native American Studies Minor or as a general elective.

If your CCC major is **Psychology** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Social Science (BSSS) Degree with a Psychology Option,** the following courses in your CCC major are recommended: PSYC-101 for your Social Science elective in general education. Elective courses in Psychology that will transfer into the Psychology Option of the BSSS include PSYC-102 Developmental, PSYC 125 Human Sexuality. Elective courses in your Coffeyville program such as SOCI-101 Introduction to Sociology, SOCI-201 American Social Problems, FACS-117 Marriage and the Family, and SOCI-290 will transfer as credit toward a Sociology minor or as open elective credit. Several courses recommended for the Psychology/Counseling degree at Coffeyville will count toward general education credit including HUMN 208 World Religions (toward the RSU Global Studies requirement), HIST-102 (toward the RSU History requirement), HUMN-104 (toward the RSU Humanity requirement), and

GOVN-104 (toward the RSU American Government requirement). Foreign language credit will also transfer to RSU as part of both general education credit (Global Studies) and Program credit.

If your CCC major is **Sociology** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Social Science (BSSS) Degree with a Sociology Option**, the following elective courses in your CCC major are recommended: SOCI-101 Introduction to Sociology, SOCI-201 American Social Problems; and FACS-107 Marriage and Family. Additional elective credit in the sociology program at Coffeyville including PSYC-102 Developmental Psychology and FAC-117 Early Childhood Development, would transfer into RSU's Psychology minor or as free elective credit. Foreign language credit will also transfer to RSU as part of both general education credit (Global Studies) and Program credit.

If your CCC major is **Sociology** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Justice Administration**, be sure to take SOCI-124 Introduction to Criminal Justice as part of your CCC degree program. Other credit earned in your Coffeyville sociology program can be used in either a sociology or psychology minor, or as elective credit in your program.

RSU Major Considerations: Biology

If your CCC major is **Biology**, **Chemistry**, **Pre-Medicine**, **or Pre-Veterinary Medicine** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Biology**, the following courses are required in the general education component of the Associate Degree at CCC: BIOL-101 General Biology and CHEM-103 Principles of Chemistry I. Additionally, the following elective courses are recommended: BIOL-201 General Zoology, BIOL-202 General Botany, CHEM-104 Principles of Chemistry II and Qualitative Analysis, PHYS-203 College Physics, PHYS-204 College Physics II.

RSU Major Considerations: Nursing

If your CCC major is nursing and upon graduation and successful licensure you are considering a **Bachelor of Science in Nursing** degree at RSU, the Transfer Guide in this agreement for an Associate in Science from CCC will satisfy the general education requirements towards the Bachelor of Science in Nursing at RSU. The following courses are requirements in the RSU program and can be completed at CCC in addition to your ADN curriculum: MATH-250 Elementary Statistics and BIOL-204 Microbiology.

RSU Major Considerations: Bachelor of Science in Business Administration

If your CCC major is Marketing/Mid-Management and you intend to transfer to RSU for a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration the following information is provided. The School of Business and Technology offers a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree with seven options: Accounting, Entrepreneurship, Forensic Accounting, Human Resources Management, Management, Manufacturing Management, and Marketing. For students selecting the BSBA the following courses will satisfy core requirements in the program: BUSN 171 Financial Accounting, BUSN 221 Managerial Accounting, ECON 205 Principles of Macroeconomics, ECON 206 Principles of Microeconomics, and MATH 250 Elementary Statistics. Students in the CCC Marketing/Mid-Management program that earn credit in BUSN 202 Marketing and BUSN 260 Business Law will have satisfied the BSBA requirements for principles of marketing and legal environment of business, but they will be required to take upper level business courses to replace the six hours of lower level business earned with the two courses. Students who plan to select Manufacturing Management as an option should take PHYS 203 College Physics I for their Physical Science requirement in General Education. Some of your remaining course work you have earned will transfer as elective hours.

RSU Major Considerations: Bachelor of Science in Business Information Technology

If your CCC major is **Computer Systems Technology** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Science in Business Information Technology** the following information is provided. The School of Business and Technology offers a Bachelor of Science in Business Information Technology with two options: Computer Network Administration and Software Development and Multimedia. For students selecting the BSBIT the following courses will satisfy core requirements in the program: COMP 221 Computer Programming–Java, COMP 203, Introduction to Computer Programming—Visual BASIC for Windows or COMP 123 Introduction to Computer Programming—BASIC, BUSN 171 Financial Accounting, and BUSN 221 Managerial Accounting. Some of your remaining course work you have earned will transfer as elective hours.

RSU Major Considerations: Bachelor of Technology in Applied Technology

If your CCC major is an **Associate in Applied Science** and you intend to transfer to RSU for a **Bachelor of Technology in Applied Technology** you may select the following courses that will be accepted in transfer for 15 hours of general education. ENGL-101 English Composition I, SPCH-111 Public Speaking, MATH-105 College Algebra or higher, COMP-161 Computer Information Systems, and three hours of humanities selected from courses listed on the transfer guide for the Associate in Arts and the Associate in Science. Thirty hours of your course work in the vocational/technical program will transfer as a technical specialty in the BTAT. Some of your remaining course work you have earned will transfer as elective hours. If you have questions, please call 918-343-7520 to talk with an advisor and request an evaluation of your CCC transcript and a determination of the remaining course work you need to complete the BTAT.

If you decide to change your major for your Bachelor degree it may be possible to convert many of your major CCC courses into a minor at RSU. Consult the RSU catalog for available minors.
