Graduating Senior Survey

Rogers State University is committed to improving its services to students and departments. To this end, RSU seeks information from its graduates regarding their college experience. The *Graduating Senior Survey* was developed in spring 2014 in conjunction with RSU's Schools of Business and Technology, Liberal Arts, and Mathematics, Science, and Health Sciences. The purpose this assessment was to measure the importance of, progress toward, and university contribution to a variety of college outcomes. Additionally, student satisfaction with university programs and services was assessed, evaluating student perceptions in overall RSU experience, general education program, and degree program.

Methodology and Participants

Invitations to participate in RSU Graduating Senior Survey were emailed to all 603 RSU graduates during the 2013-2014 AY. A total of 161 surveys was completed for a 27% response rate with a 28% response rate for graduates from an associate degree program and a 25% response rate for graduates from a baccalaureate program. Participation was voluntary with no compensation.

Female graduates were more likely to participate, and a total of 77% of respondents were female (66% of RSU graduates were female). Thirty-two percent of respondents were under the age of 25, compared to 38% of RSU's graduates. Race and ethnicity were not queried.

Findings

Descriptive statistics were calculated for all items. A total of 90% of respondents were somewhat or very satisfied with their overall RSU experience (59% very satisfied); and 84% were somewhat or very satisfied with their general education experience (45% very satisfied). Overall Department experience achieved the highest satisfaction with 93% somewhat or very satisfied (54% very satisfied). General education outcomes were highly positive with the following satisfaction percentages (somewhat or very satisfied) for each of RSU's general education outcomes:

- Thinking critically and creatively (99%)
- Acquiring, analyzing, and evaluating knowledge of human cultures and the physical and natural world (98%)
- Using written, oral, and visual communication effectively (98%)
- Developing an individual perspective on the human experience, and demonstrating an understanding of diverse perspectives and values (96%)
- Demonstrating civic knowledge and engagement, ethical reasoning, and skills for lifelong learning (87%)

Regarding maintenance of high academic standards, 93% were somewhat or very satisfied. Nearly nine out of ten (87%) were satisfied with academic advising in their departments. A majority of graduates (73%) intended to pursue another degree after graduation.

A total of 82.8% of respondents reported they were pursuing another degree and/or working full-time. 70.3% of baccalaureate degree respondents reported they were pursuing another degree and/or working full-time. 94.8% of associate degree respondents reported they were pursuing another degree and/or working full-time.






