



Vaccine Requirements for Students Residing on Campus at Rogers State University

In addition to the 2 MMR's and the 3 Hepatitis B vaccines required for enrollment to Rogers State University, residents are required to show documentation of the Meningococcal vaccine in order to comply with the immunization requirements of Oklahoma state law (Oklahoma statute, Title 70§3242).

The law permits that when the vaccine is medically contraindicated and a licensed physician has signed a written statement to that effect, such students shall be exempt from the immunization. Further, the law permits a student, or if the student is a minor, the student's parent or legal guardian, to sign a written waiver stating that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the student's moral or religious tenets.

The waiver can be accessed on-line by going to the forms link on the Student Health Center web site.

The Meningococcal vaccine is available at the Rogers County Health Department or your primary care physician.

You may move into Rogers State University Apartments as soon as you receive the vaccine or have a waiver on file. If a waiver is signed, the resident would have to evacuate in the event+ of a confirmed case of meningitis.
