Students, Faculty Participate in Volunteer Activities

More than 160 members of the RSU family recently engaged in community service activities as part of RSU's Martin Luther King Jr. Week of Service. (January)

Students Providing Free Tax Preparation Assistance

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program, which was staffed by trained and certified student volunteers and available to low-income individuals or families. This is the third year RSU has offered this service. (January)

Student-Athletes Hold 'Prom' at Local Senior Center

RSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) organized a "Senior Prom" for residents at a Claremore assisted living center. Administrators at The Brookfield said it was one of the most popular events held at the facility, with residents expressing enthusiasm for interacting with the college students. (April)

Students Organize Day of Care for Domestic Violence Victims

RSU students worked with local non-profits to organize the 4th annual Day of Care focused on needs of women and children who had experienced domestic violence. (April)

RSU Reaffirmed for Accreditation

RSU received official notification in a May 14 letter that the university was reaffirmed for continuing its accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission. RSU was determined to have met all five criteria for accreditation with no concerns listed. The next reaffirmation of accreditation is scheduled for 2024-25. (May)

Students Get Real-World Experience during D.C. Internships

Seth Blanton, a military history senior from Midwest City, and Edgar Zetina, a business administration senior from Pryor, interned in Washington, D.C., during the spring semester as part of The Washington Center Internship Program. (May)

Rahn Selected as Brad Henry International Scholar

Matthew Rahn, a communications junior from Claremore, was selected through a competitive process to spend the spring 2016 semester at Swansea University in Wales as part of the Brad Henry International Scholars Program. (June)

RSU Holds STEM Camp for Low-Income Students

RSU hosted 30 area students for a week-long ART (Appreciating Real-World Technology) Academy this summer designed to offer junior and high school students a hands-on experience with technology used in various fields of study, including leadership development, robotics, media production, microphotography and crime scene investigation. They were paired with current RSU students who serve as mentors during the camp. (June)

RSU Achieves NCAA Division II Provisional Status

RSU received notification this summer from the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) that it has been granted provisional membership, successfully completing the second year of the three-year Division II membership process. (July)

Fall Enrollment Increases

RSU was one of the only Oklahoma regional universities to show an enrollment increase for the fall 2016 semester, with 4,092 students, which is a 1.5% increase over the previous fall. (August)

University Village C Opens

In August, the university opened its newest campus housing facility, University Village C, which added more than 300 beds to a Residential Life system that now has capacity for more than 800 oncampus residents. Designated for freshman housing, University Village C is organized into small community spaces with five bedrooms clustered around a shared bathroom space. (August)

Degree Programs Earn Recognition for Value

RSU's bachelor degree in justice administration was ranked 11th among the nation's 50 Best Value Colleges for a Criminal Justice Degree 2015 by BestValueSchools.com, while AffordableCollegesOnline.org named RSU's business information technology degree program as Oklahoma's top-ranked computer science program. (August)

U.S. News Recognizes RSU for Low Student Debt, Diversity

RSU was recognized among the region's top schools for lowest student debt upon graduation and most ethnically diverse student bodies, according to U.S. News & World Report's Best Colleges annual survey. This is the fourth consecutive year U.S. News' Best Colleges has recognized RSU for having graduates with low student debt. (September)

RSU Receives Largest Gift from an Individual to Establish Scholarship Endowments

RSU students have two new scholarship opportunities thanks to the legacy of Oklahoma Military Academy distinguished alumnus Jack Harris, who established a trust to provide funds for the establishment of two scholarship endowments prior to his death. (September)


RSU Makes Graduate Education More Accessible

RSU adjusted its MBA degree to make it make it more accessible for students without a business background and to offer all classes in an 8-week format that will allow students to earn a graduate degree in as little as 18 months. The changes took effect for the spring 2016 semester and are designed to meet the needs of students, especially for working professionals. (October)







Total Semester Hours (Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)














Concurrent High School Student Headcount

Unduplicated Headcount by Goal



Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Graduate






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Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Undergraduate

Unduplicated Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Graduate



Online Headcount





(Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)












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Average ACT for Claremore Students Who Submitted Scores





Pryor Total Semester Hours




Pryor Headcount by Gender and Level








Pryor Headcount by Age


Pryor Headcount by Race/Ethnicity



Bartlesville Duplicated Headcount and FTE






Bartlesville Total Semester Hours




Full-time/Part-time 2015








Bartlesville Concurrent High School Student Headcount


Bartlesville Headcount by Goal







Bartlesville Headcount by Race/Ethnicity






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Average ACT for Bartlesville Students Who Submitted Scores



Bartlesville Headcount by County (Oklahoma)



Online Duplicated Headcount and FTE








Online Headcount by Gender and Level




Online Concurrent High School Student Headcount

Online Headcount by Goal





Online Headcount by Age





Online Headcount by Race/Ethnicity






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Average ACT for Online Students Who Submitted Scores

Glossary of Terms

- **Credit (Semester) Hour**—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- Audit—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for "audit" enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- Unduplicated Count—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- Site—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- Classification
 - Freshman—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
 - **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
 - **Junior**—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
 - Senior—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college <u>or</u> who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F's, and excluding W's and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **Concurrent High School Student** A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- **Non-Degree Seeking**—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

Glossary of Funding Terms

- E & G 1—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- **E & G 2**—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- Auxiliary—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- **Capital**—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- Academic Support—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- **Institutional Support**—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Plant**—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
