2019 Hillcat Headlines

Nearly 600 Students Earn Diplomas. RSU's 106th Commencement featured nearly 600 graduates receiving associate, bachelor's and master's degrees during the May 11 ceremony. Since RSU received accreditation as a baccalaureate-granting institution in 2000, RSU has awarded nearly 8,000 diplomas, including nearly about 4,000 bachelor's degrees and about 4,000 associate degrees.

Student Leaders Honored With 2019 HILL Awards. RSU honored thirty students, two recent alumni and two community partners during its second annual HILL Awards. The awards recognize High Impact Leaders and Leaders (HILL) among the student body with awards presented for each level of academic classification as well as student workers.

RSU Named Oklahoma's Safest College Campus. Rogers State University was ranked the safest college campus in Oklahoma and 13th safest campus in the nation, according to a new ranking released by the National Council for Home Safety and Security. The organization ranked 490 of the nation's largest schools based on crime data submitted to the FBI, as well as similar data for the areas surrounding campuses.

RSU Launches Online MBA Program. RSU now offers a completely online MBA degree program at a price lower that most universities. Specifically designed to meet the needs of today's online student. Oklahoma residents can complete the MBA@RSU program for about \$10,880 in total residential tuition and fees.

RSU Names Directory of First Year and Experience. RSU has named Tracy Emmons as Director of First-Year and Transfer Experience to oversee the implementation, evaluation and continuous improvement of programs to orient first-year and transfer student to university life.

RSU Dean Receives Profile in Excellence. Dean of the School of Professional Studies, Dr. Susan Willis received the Profile in Excellence Award from her alma mater, Oklahoma Baptist University. The award is presented to graduates who have demonstrated recognizable accomplishment in their profession.

MBA@RSU Receives Quality Matters Certification for Course Design. RSU's Strategic Global Marketing course received the nationally recognized Quality Matters Certification for meeting course design standards in an official QM peer review. The course is part of the Master in Business Administration curriculum developed by Dr. Dana Moore Gray.

RSU Community Supports "S.M.I.L.E." Angel Tree and Local Nursing Home. Members of the RSU community supported a very deserving segment of the school's student body this holiday season with contributions to the Single Mothers Inspiring Lifelong Education (S.M.I.L.E.) angel tree. The initiative, lead by RSU Student Engagement Specialist Kayla Conklin, supported twenty-nine children of single-parent students.

Student Affairs Adds GEAR UP College Coach Position. With grant funding from OSRHE, student affairs was able to on-board a GEAR UP College Coach position. Oklahoma **GEAR UP** is designed to prepare middle and high school students for college success through direct student support services, college access and financial aid information and assistance, and school faculty and staff collaboration and leadership opportunities.

RSU Hosts 7th **Annual Aero Games Powered by Google.** More than 100 students from 15 teams participated in the Aero Games challenge to build a flight-worthy drone and fly it through a complex obstacle course designed specifically for the event. The course included six components: Elevated Pass Thru; Vertical Slalom; Bullseye Landing and Vertical Takeoff; Three-Point 180-Degree Turn; Obstacle X-treme Wind Challenge; and a Top Cup Pyramid Finish. Googlers scored the competition using objective criteria such as time, speed, distance, and accuracy. This is the 7th year that RSU has partnered with Google to host this STEM-based competition for area students. The obstacle course was designed by the RSU AeroCats Leadership Team, a group of RSU seniors who facilitated this year's competition as part of their final capstone project under the direction of RSU faculty member Curtis Sparling.

RSU Native American Heritage Festival. A stomp dance, Native American storytelling, powwow drum and singing presentation, make-and-take arts and crafts, and lecture on traditional agricultural systems was featured during the 22nd Annual Native American Heritage Festival on Saturday, Nov. 2, at Rogers State University.

RSU Hosts Reconnect Activity Week. For those who started college but didn't complete a degree program, RSU offered a week's worth of activities from July 27 to August 1 designed to help connect adult learners with the school's degree completion programs. Each come-and-go event during the week included the opportunity to meet with RSU representatives about degree programs and financial aid, as well as answer questions about returning to college. The activities are part of a statewide campaign to support Oklahoma's Reach Higher program, which focuses on helping adults complete their college degrees.

RSU Named State's Top Game Design School. RSU was named Oklahoma's top game design school, according to a recent report released by Animation Career Review. <u>Animation Career Review</u> determined school rankings based on several qualities, including academic reputation, depth and breadth of the program, value as it relates to tuition and indebtedness, geographic location and employment data. RSU began its game development curriculum in 2006 and was one of the first schools in Oklahoma to offer this unique focus. RSU offers a <u>bachelor's degree in</u> information technology with a game development option, which is available online.

RSU Student-Athletes Recognized by Heartland Conference for Academic Achievement. 112 Rogers State University student-athletes received recognition for their academic achievements in the spring semester with places on the Heartland Conference President's and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A total of 66 student-athletes were placed on President's Honor Roll honors for maintaining a grade point average of 3.5 or higher during the fall semester. The remaining 46 were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll after posting a minimum grade point average of 3.0.

RSU Recognized in Tulsa Charity Walk. Rogers State University students, faculty, and staff participated in the <u>Tulsa National Eating Disorders Association (NEDA) Walk</u> at Veterans Park in Tulsa. RSU received special recognition for being the largest team and also placed second for team fundraising with \$2,467 raised. <u>Dr. Sonya Munsell</u>, Assistant Professor of <u>Psychology and Sociology</u>, earned recognition for being the second highest individual fundraiser, raising \$1,851.

OMA Alumni Holding Flag-Raising Ceremony to Celebrate 100th Anniversary. The <u>Oklahoma Military</u> <u>Academy Alumni Association</u> held a Feb. 28 flag-raising ceremony to celebrate the 100th anniversary of OMA's founding. In commemoration of the 100th anniversary of OMA, the OMA Alumni Association has created a special centennial flag that will fly over the campus during the year. The flag was unveiled to the public during the ceremony February 28th, at the flag pole at RSU's entrance off Will Rogers Blvd.

RSU Brings \$93 Million Economic Impact to Community. Rogers State University provides an annual economic impact of more than \$93 million and provides among the highest returns on investment among Oklahoma's regional universities, according to a recently released economic impact study released by the State Chamber of Oklahoma. The State Chamber Research Foundation found that RSU generated \$55.5 million in direct expenditures, which supported about \$93.4 million in total economic impact in the communities it serves .According to the study, RSU had the fourth highest ratio of economic output to appropriations at 7.6, meaning that every dollar Oklahomans invested in RSU's state appropriations provided a return on investment of \$7.60. This high output of economic impact comes despite RSU having the eighth lowest state appropriation among Oklahoma regional universities and the second lowest per student appropriation

RSU Partners with Mayes County Robotics Team. Rogers State University is collaborating with the Mayes County Robotics Team (MCROBO), a consolidated FIRST Robotics team of high school students from Mayes County, to provide high school and college students access to robotic technology. The MCROBO team was recently awarded a \$11,500.00 grant from the Oliver Dewey Mayor Foundation to promote robotics education. The successful grant proposal focused on securing resources that would allow the team to expand STEM and Robotics education and awareness in northeast Oklahoma. The team secured resources that will allow them to serve area youth, educators and college students through a variety of programs and experiences.

Glossary of Terms

- Credit (Semester) Hour—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- Audit—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for "audit" enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- Unduplicated Count—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- Site—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- Classification
 - Freshman—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
 - **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
 - Junior—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
 - Senior—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college <u>or</u> who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F's, and excluding W's and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **Concurrent High School Student** A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- Non-Degree Seeking—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

Glossary of Funding Terms

- E & G 1—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- E & G 2—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- Auxiliary—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- **Capital**—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- Academic Support—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- **Institutional Support**—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Plant**—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
