#### **Hillcat Headlines 2021**

Rogers State, OU-Tulsa Combine Efforts to Advance Higher Ed Opportunities in Tulsa. RSU and OU-Tulsa are offering new opportunities to increase the region's college educated workforce. Upper-level classes of RSU degree programs in Business Administration and Public Affairs will now be offered at the OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center. The offerings follow an agreement filed jointly by RSU President Dr. Larry Rice and OU-Tulsa President Dr. John Schumann with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The agreement marks the first time in history that RSU classes will be available in Tulsa.

Pryor High School Innovation Center at RSU Slated to Open This Fall. The Pryor High School Innovation Center will be housed at the Pryor Campus of RSU in the MidAmerica Industrial Park. It will be home to the Pryor High School Esports program and Tech Lab. Classes held at the Innovation Center will include manufacturing, engineeringand robotics. Beginning their junior year, students at Pryor High School will be able to join an accelerated pathway toward earning a college degree through this new partnership. Students will earn high school and college credit at the same time potentially earning up to an entire year of college course work before high school graduation.

**RSU Adds Five Options in the Master of Business Administration.** The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education approved five new degree options for Rogers State University's Master of Business Administration during their May meeting. The new options include management, accounting, sport management, data analytics and healthcare management. New class offerings in these options will begin in the upcoming Fall 2021 semester.


**RSU Esports Named OACE Tournament Champions.** The Rogers State University Esports team was named tournament champions this month in Oklahoma Association of Collegiate Esports' Battle for Oklahoma tournament. RSU secured the victory with University of Tulsa placing second. Other competitors included Oklahoma State University, Northeastern Oklahoma State University, Southwestern Oklahoma State University and Redlands Community College.

RSU Announces New Master's Degree in Community Counseling. Rogers State University is enrolling its first cohort in its second master's degree for the upcoming fall 2021 semester. The Master of Science in Community Counseling received final accreditation approval earlier this month. Students will train for licensure and professional counseling roles in mental health, community, human services and school settings. The program prepares students to sit for the National Counselor Exam and the Oklahoma Legal and Ethical Responsibilities Exam required by the Oklahoma State Board of Behavioral Health.

RSU is First University in Oklahoma to be Named Warrior Campus. Rogers State University Associate Professor of Psychology and Sociology Dr. Sonya Munsell has actively led RSU's chapter of the National Eating Disorder Association. Her passion for wellness has helped RSU initiate a Campus Warrior team, a student group raising awareness for eating disorders on campuses across the country. RSU is the first university in Oklahoma to become a Warrior Campus.

RSU Nursing Program Celebrates 40 Years of Excellence. The nursing program at Rogers State University is celebrating 40 years of educating the next generation of healthcare workers since the program's inception in 1981, and the Rogers State University Alumni Association will mark the anniversary by inviting program graduates back to campus. The inaugural nursing class graduated in 1983, and since then, the program and its renowned faculty have received national recognition for high-quality programs, leadership in improving patient outcomes in Oklahoma hospitals, and commitment to educating seasoned nurses with additional degrees and certifications.

**RSU Wins Four Statewide PR and Marketing Awards**. The Rogers State University Office of Communications and Marketing earned four awards during the Oklahoma College Public Relations Association's annual awards competition held earlier this month. During the past decade RSU has earned 37 OCPRA awards, including eight first-place awards in the annual competition among all Oklahoma public and private colleges and universities ranging from two-year colleges to the state's comprehensive universities.



# **Unduplicated Headcount and FTE** (Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)





Total Semester Hours (Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)










# Male/Female FALL 2021



### **Concurrent High School Student Headcount**










#### **Average ACT for Claremore Students Who Submitted Scores**










### **Bartlesville Concurrent High School Student Headcount**




### **Average ACT for Bartlesville Students Who Submitted Scores**










### **Average ACT for Online Students Who Submitted Scores**

### **Glossary of Terms**

- Credit (Semester) Hour—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- **Audit**—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for "audit" enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- **Unduplicated Count**—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- **Site**—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- Classification
  - o Freshman—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
  - o **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
  - o **Junior**—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
  - o **Senior**—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college <u>or</u> who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F's, and excluding W's and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- Concurrent High School Student— A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- **Non-Degree Seeking**—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

### **Glossary of Funding Terms**

- E & G 1—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- E & G 2—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- Auxiliary—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- Capital—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- **Academic Support**—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- Institutional Support—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- Operation and Maintenance of Plant—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
