## **Hillcat Headlines 2022**

**Renovated Oklahoma Military Academy Museum Opens to the Public on Rogers State University Campus.** Members of the public will have the opportunity to experience the newly renovated Oklahoma Military Academy Museum on the campus of Rogers State University Monday, Sept. 26, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. The museum is located on the campus of RSU on the second floor of Meyer Hall. OMA Alumni Association Executive Director Dr. Danette Boyle said the restoration project, which lasted for more than a year, is designed to preserve the legacy of OMA for new generations. The project has been guided by Dr. Bob Blackburn, who recently retired as executive director of the Oklahoma History Center in Oklahoma City.

**RSU's 'Dream Team' Receives National Championship Rings.** Four months after claiming the NCAA Division II softball national championship, the 2021-22 Rogers State University softball team received their championship rings Sept. 22. Held in the ballroom of the Dr. Carolyn Taylor Center, the National Championship Ring Ceremony welcomed back the team in a 5:30 p.m. ceremony that recognized them and honored their historic championship. The Hillcats brought home the university's first national championship with a 6-1 victory over Cal State Dominguez in May 2022, capping off a 58-10 season that also included a MIAA Tournament Championship.

**Freshman, Transfer Enrollment up at Rogers State University.** Enrollment of first-time freshmen and transfer students has increased for the fall semester at Rogers State University. The number of first-time freshmen increased 4.3 percent from a year ago to 509 students, while the number of transfer students jumped 14.3 percent to 272, according to a preliminary enrollment report. Overall, enrollment for the current fall semester is nearly the same as last fall, with 3,215 students enrolled at RSU's main campus in Claremore, branch campuses in Bartlesville and Pryor, and in online courses.

**RSU Recognized in Latest U.S. News and World Report Rankings.** A combination of quality academics, affordability and accessibility placed Rogers State University among the top regional colleges in the western United States in this year's U.S. News and World Report college rankings released today. RSU was ranked No. 14 in the Regional Colleges category and ranked No. 6 among the Top Public Schools in the west. The western United States grouping consists of 15 states, including Oklahoma, Texas and California. RSU also was recognized at No. 4 as a Best Value School. The calculation used considers a school's academic quality, as indicated by its U.S. News ranking, and the 2021-2022 net cost of attendance for an out-of-state student who received the average level of need-based financial aid. Only schools ranked in or near the top half of their categories are included because U.S. News considers the most significant values to be among colleges that are above average academically.


**RSU Honors Graduates at 110th Commencement.** Rogers State University celebrated more than 500 graduates during its 110th commencement ceremonies Saturday, May 7, at the

Claremore Expo Center. Since becoming a university in 2000, RSU has awarded more than 10,400 diplomas. The ceremony honored retiring faculty Dr. Roy Gardner, Dr. Mary Mackie and Roya Namavar. During the ceremony, Dr. Sonya Munsell was presented the 2022 Pixley Excellence in Education Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a member of the RSU faculty. The award recognizes excellence in all areas of faculty accomplishment including teaching, scholarship, creativity and service. The Pixley award is made possible by the Pixley Endowment for Excellence in Education at RSU. This year's commencement speaker was University of Oklahoma Regent Anita Holloway. In her remarks she shared advice from her experience encouraging the graduates to commit to lifelong learning, be courageous when opportunities come along and to show resilience in times of disappointment.

**Rogers State University Students Receive Awards in 2022 OBEA Competition.** Rogers State University students took home a record number of awards for their outstanding work in video, audio, scriptwriting and new media at the Oklahoma Broadcast Education Association student award competition held March 24. "Our students demonstrate their gifts and talent in this competition. Our communication faculty bring years of real-world experience to the classroom," said Lee Williams, assistant professor in the Department of Communications. "Each year our program gets stronger and our students get stronger. We build each other." OBEA holds the annual competition for undergraduate students enrolled at its member institutions across the state, which include public and private colleges and universities ranging from twoyear colleges to the state's comprehensive universities.

**Eight RSU Allied Health Students Accepted to Graduate School.** Rogers State University's allied health program announced that eight students have been accepted into graduate schools for physical therapy, occupational therapy and athletic training. RSU's Bachelor of Science in allied health sciences was established in 2019. The pre-athletic training students include Mya Hilderbrand, from Owasso; and Sabrina Anguiano, from Riverside, California. The pre-physical therapy students include Maisie Schroeder, from Hartford, Kansas; Kaylee Bobbitt, from Greenville, Texas; Abigail Taylor, from Midwest City; Elexis Watson, from Muskogee; and Yasmy McHenry, from Owasso. Claremore native Breanna farmer will attend graduate school for pre-occupational therapy.

**RSU Receives \$1 Million Gift in Honor of the Late Alyson Marie Knight.** An endowment that provides scholarships for students at Rogers State University, named in honor of the late Alyson Marie Knight, recently received a \$1 million gift. The gift was given by her father, Dr. James P. Knight, last month. Knight is a 1967 graduate of the Oklahoma Military Academy, active member of the OMA Alumni Association and comes from a family of long-time RSU supporters. The endowment honors the legacy of his daughter who died tragically days before her high school graduation. Alyson was a gifted and high achieving student who was due to graduate top of her class. "The generosity of Jim Knight is a testament to his values and an honor to his late daughter," said RSU President Dr. Larry Rice. "With this gift, the Alyson Marie Knight Memorial Scholarship Endowment will create a lasting impact for generations to come."





#### Claremore Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Undergraduate




#### **Claremore Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Graduate**







## **Pryor Duplicated Headcount and FTE**








#### **Pryor Headcount by Age**






### Bartlesville Headcount by Race/Ethnicity







# Bartlesville Headcount by County (Oklahoma)



## **Online Duplicated Headcount and FTE**











# **Glossary of Terms**

- Credit (Semester) Hour—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- Audit—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for "audit" enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- Unduplicated Count—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- Site—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- Classification
  - Freshman—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
  - **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
  - Junior—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
  - Senior—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college <u>or</u> who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F's, and excluding W's and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **Concurrent High School Student** A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- Non-Degree Seeking—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

# **Glossary of Funding Terms**

- E & G 1—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- E & G 2—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- Auxiliary—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- **Capital**—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- Academic Support—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- **Institutional Support**—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Plant**—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
