Hillcat Headlines 2023

U.S. News and World Report Ranks RSU as Best in Oklahoma for Regional Colleges, Top Public Schools. U.S. News and World Report has ranked Rogers State University as the top university in the state of Oklahoma in two categories. The rankings were released Monday, Sept. 18, as part of U.S. News and World Report's "2024 Best Colleges" rankings for colleges and universities. RSU ranked 10th on the list of "Top Public Schools – Regional Colleges of the West," the highest ranking for any college or university in the state of Oklahoma. The "West" region includes 15 states, ranging from Oklahoma and Texas, all the way to California and the west coast. Rogers State received another top rating in the state of Oklahoma, ranking 31st on the list for "Overall Rank – Regional Colleges of the West," again beating out all other institutions in the state. RSU received recognition in the 35th position for "Top Performers on Social Mobility–Regional Colleges of the West," the second highest ranking for any college or university in the state.

RSU and Saint Francis Health System Partner to Offer Bachelor of Science in Nursing in Tulsa. Saint Francis Health System and Rogers State University announced a partnership April 3 to educate nursing students at Saint Francis Hospital in Tulsa starting in August. The announcement was made Monday afternoon during a news conference held in the main lobby of Saint Francis Hospital at 61st and Yale. Saint Francis will serve as an extended campus of RSU, and Rogers State University will award the Bachelor of Science in Nursing upon students' graduation. The extended campus will open in fall 2023 for students who have been accepted into the Rogers State University nursing program. Applications for the spring 2024 semester began April 1.

Rogers State University Launches Chemical Engineering Degree for Fall 2023 Start. Rogers State University announced its new Bachelor of Science in chemical engineering program during a special event Dec. 15 on its Claremore campus. The BS in chemical engineering will be housed within RSU's College of Arts and Sciences in the Department of Mathematics and Physical Sciences. It is the first engineering degree offered at RSU. The first cohort of chemical engineering students begin classes in fall 2023 on the Claremore campus.

Allied Health Sciences Program Enrollment 'Explodes' at Rogers State University. Necessity, as the saying goes, is the mother of invention. Such is the case with Rogers State University's Bachelor of Science in allied health sciences degree program – a course of study developed when RSU faculty recognized the need for a program to address the demand for students interested in careers for which degrees didn't yet exist at RSU. Since its implementation, the allied health program has grown exponentially, with roughly 100 students currently enrolled in the program. Rogers State University offers concentrations to help tailor a student's educational journey to their specific career goals, also providing business classes as electives for allied health sciences majors who are interested in positions as medical or health service managers.

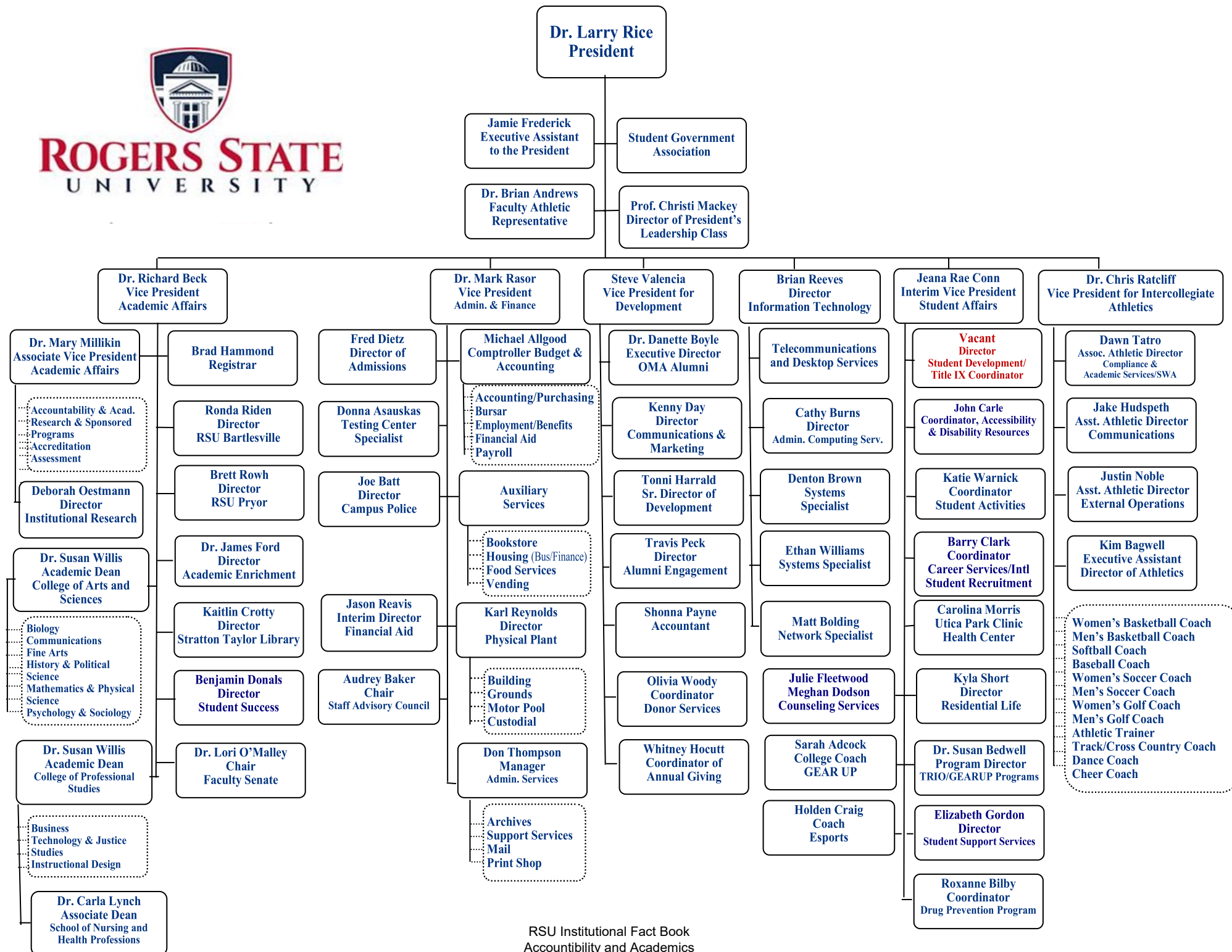
Giving Week Donation Funds RSU's First Robotics Team. Rogers State University having its own robotics team has long been a goal of Technology and Justice Studies Department Head and AeroCats Advisor Curtis Sparling. An anonymous Giving Week donation to RSU's AeroCats drone team has funded the development of the university's first robotics team. The robotics team, which will be called "The RoboClaws" in a nod to the "Fear the Claw" motto for the RSU Hillcats, will consist of RSU students My Le, Nghi Nyguen and Kai Nguyen, all three from Vietnam. The team has secured storage and built workstations, which have been filled with the necessary tools and equipment, and the purchase of a 12' x 12' competition stage (or field) has been approved. This will allow the team to both practice for and host competitions.

RSU Senior Interns at Tulsa Area Biotechnology Education and Research Consortium. Rogers State University senior Garrett Ringler spent the summer semester as an intern for the Tulsa Area Biotechnology Education and Research Consortium (TABERC). Ringler, a native of Skiatook, is a senior majoring in biology with a medical/molecular biology option. As an intern for TABERC, Ringler spent the summer conducting research focused on understanding how animals sense temperature changes. Much of Ringler's research was facilitated in the lab of RSU Department of Biology Associate Professor and Department Head Dr. Jin Seo.

RSU Ranked in Top Five Universities in Oklahoma. U.S. News & World Report has compiled a 2022-2023 ranking of universities in Oklahoma. Rogers State University ranked as the fifth best university in the entire state, behind only the two flagship schools, OU and OSU, as well as two private universities. RSU ranked higher than all other colleges and universities in the state, including all other regional universities. The Oklahoman featured this news in its July 17 edition. In an article citing U.S. News & World Report's 2022-23 rankings and titled "Report: These are the Top 10 Colleges and Universities in Oklahoma," RSU ranked fifth in the state, based on a combination of quality academics, campus size, affordability and accessibility.

RSU Named Recipient of \$200,000 HEPS Grant to Combat Substance Abuse. Rogers State University has been named the recipient of a \$200,000 Higher Education Prevention Services (HEPS) grant through the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. The grant is designed to provide education regarding drug abuse to RSU students, faculty and staff, and to address suicide awareness and education. The OKDMHSAS partners with universities across the state to facilitate funding for programs to educate and prevent prescription drug misuse. This grant will make possible the hiring of a part-time trained contractor to host educational programs, to conduct drug awareness workshops, and to help the university combat potential opioid and prescription stimulant abuse.

RSU Honors More Than 600 Graduates at 111th Commencement May 13. RSU conferred more than 600 degrees and certificates during its 111th commencement ceremonies May 13. The university hosted two commencement ceremonies, with graduates from the School of Professional Studies receiving their diplomas in the morning and graduates from the School of Arts and Sciences, Cameron University, Honors and PLC being recognized in the afternoon. Dr. Susan Willis and Dr. Keith Martin delivered the commencement addresses.

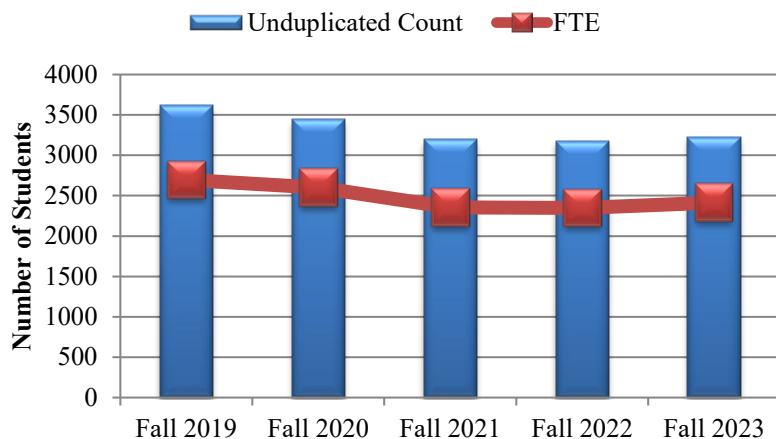

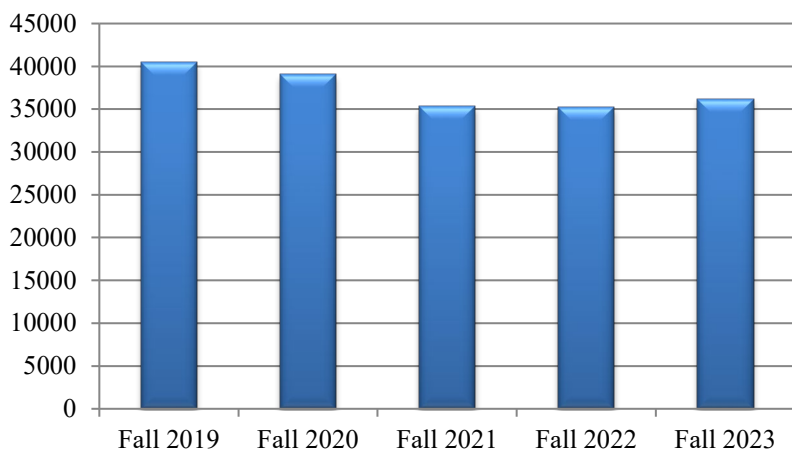


Unduplicated Headcount and FTE (Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)



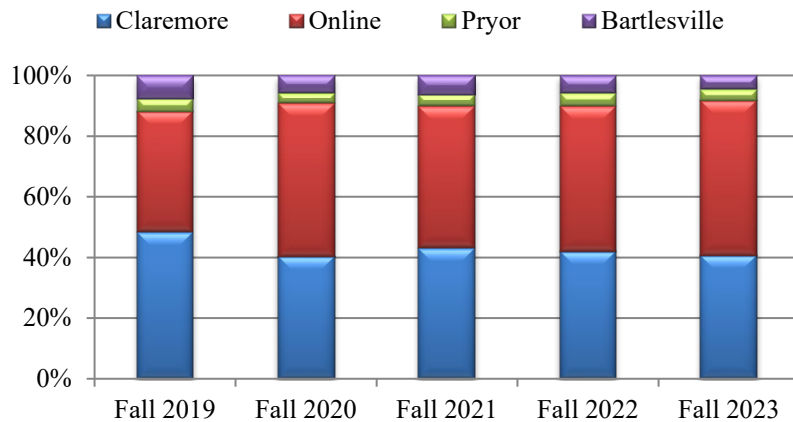

Total Semester Hours (Undergraduate and Graduate Combined)



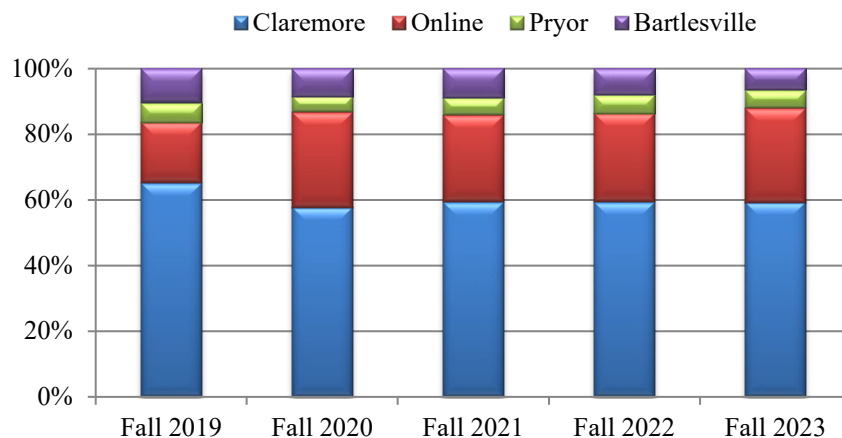

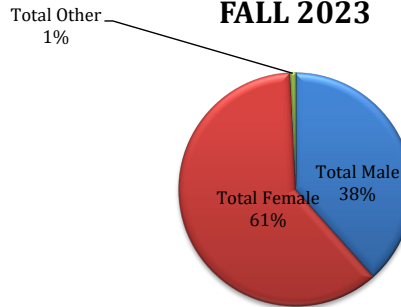

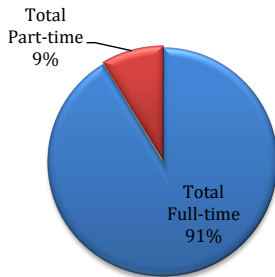

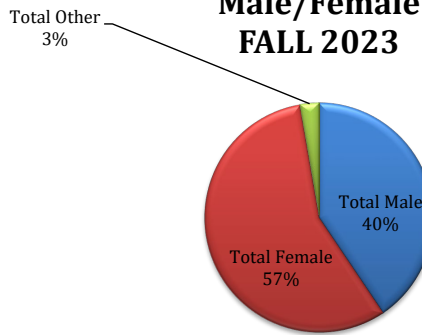

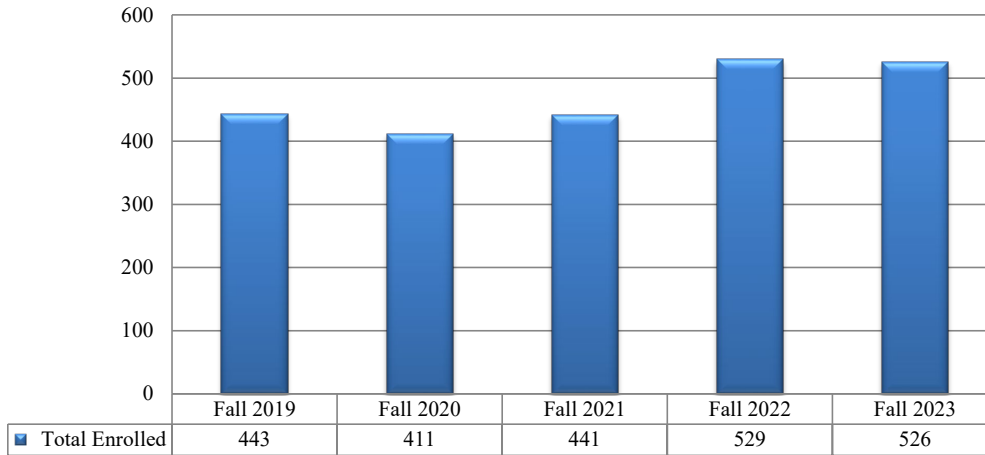

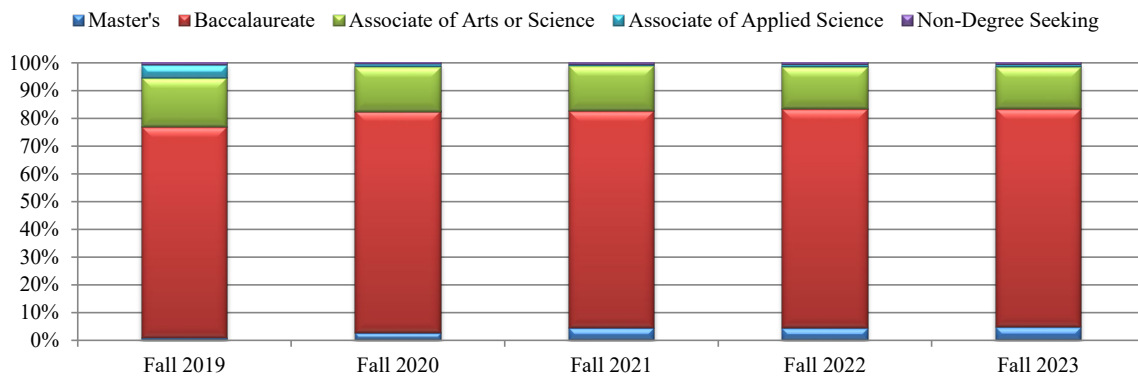
Male/Female FALL 2023



Concurrent High School Student Headcount

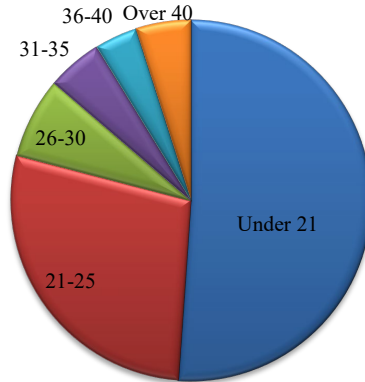

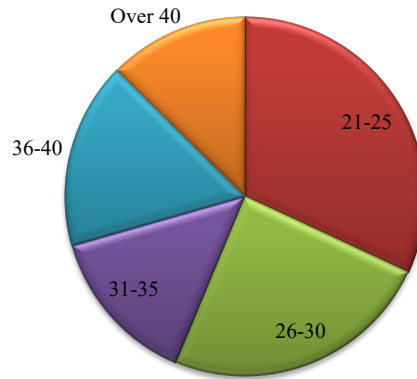
Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Undergraduate

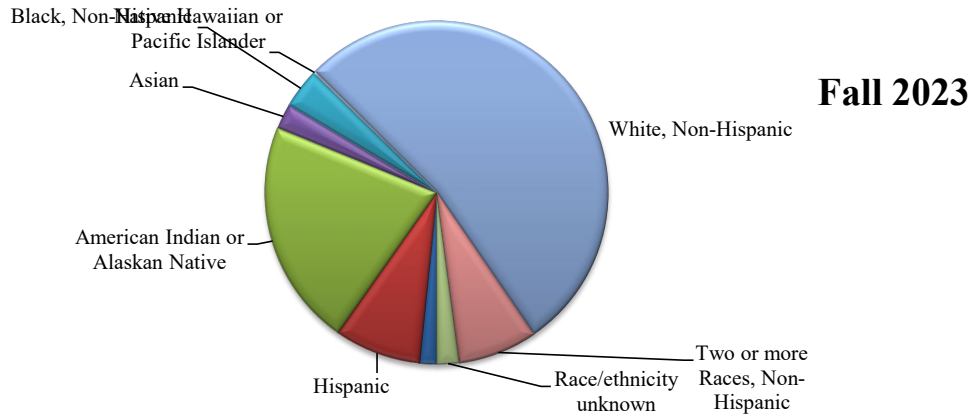
Unduplicated Headcount by Age- Graduate

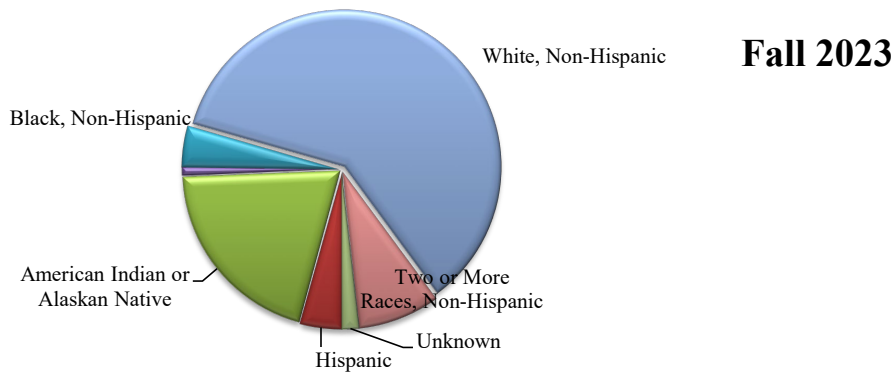

Unduplicated Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Undergraduate



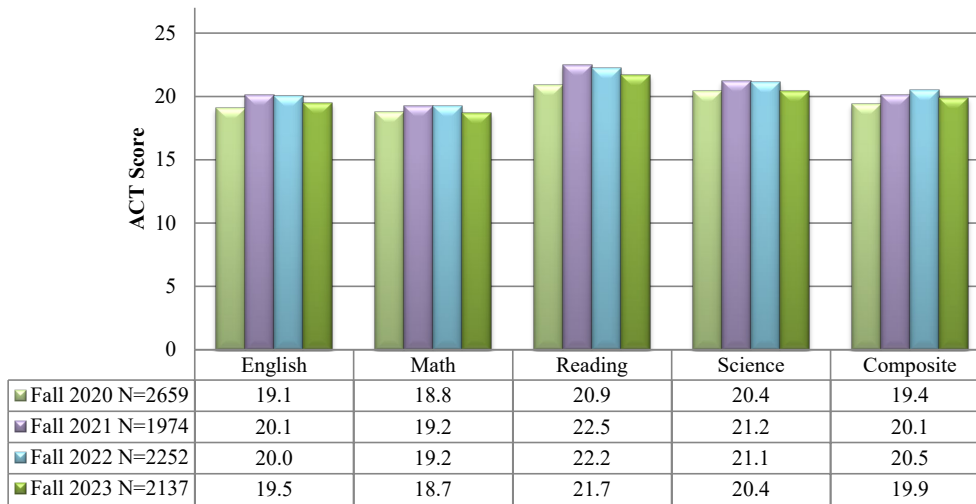

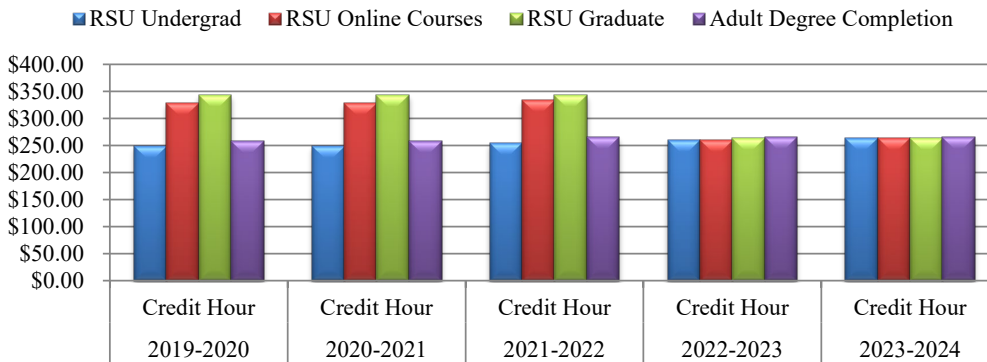
Full-time Faculty by Rank

Claremore Headcount by Age- Graduate



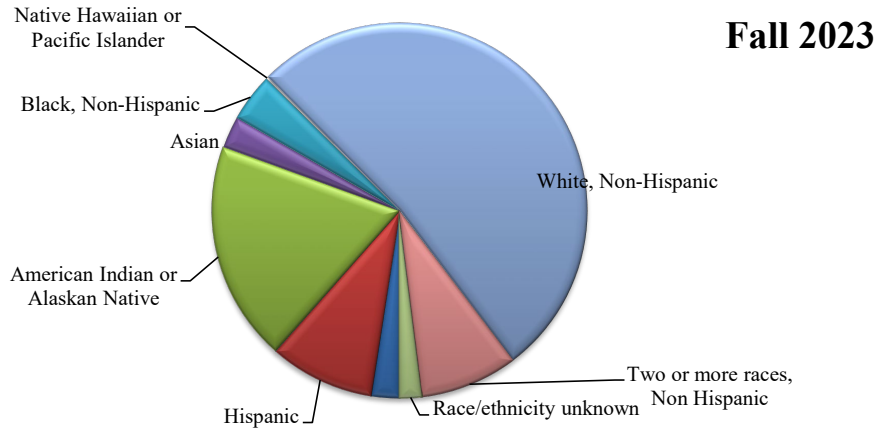

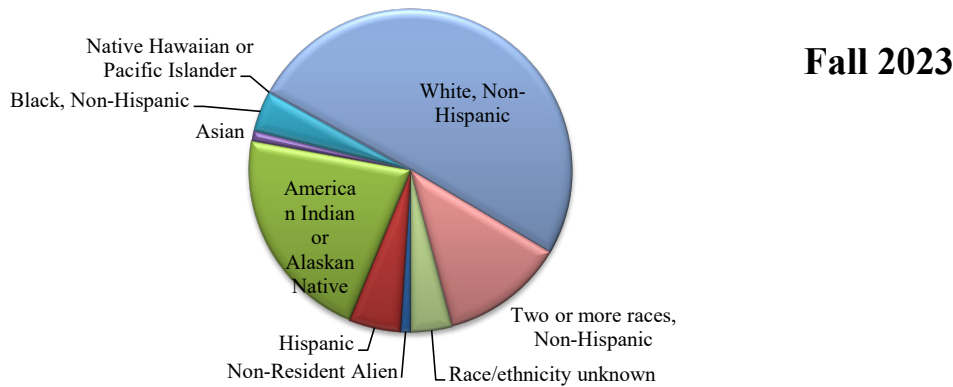

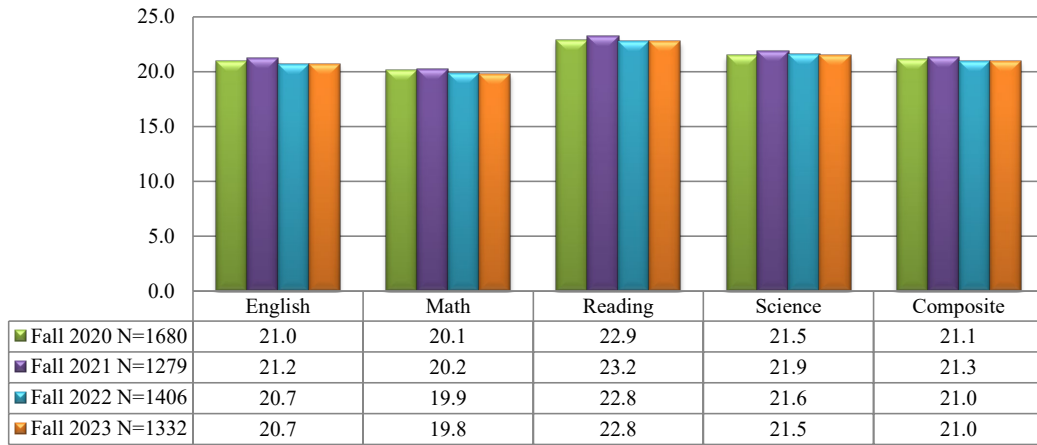
Claremore Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Graduate



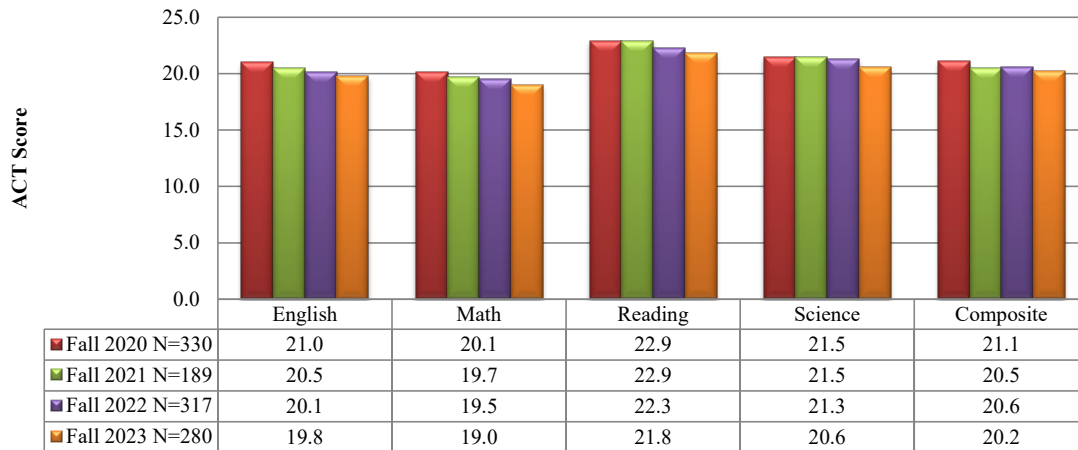

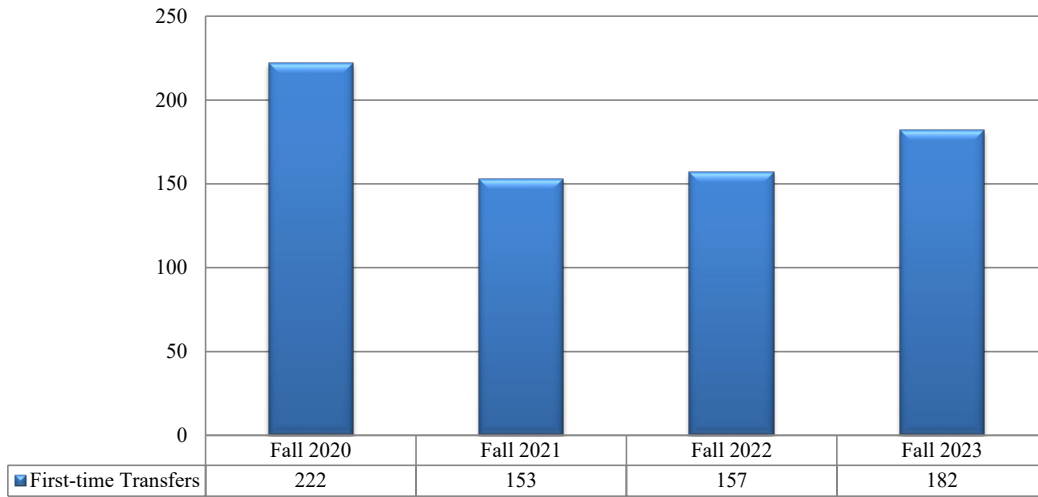
Average ACT for Claremore Students Who Submitted Scores

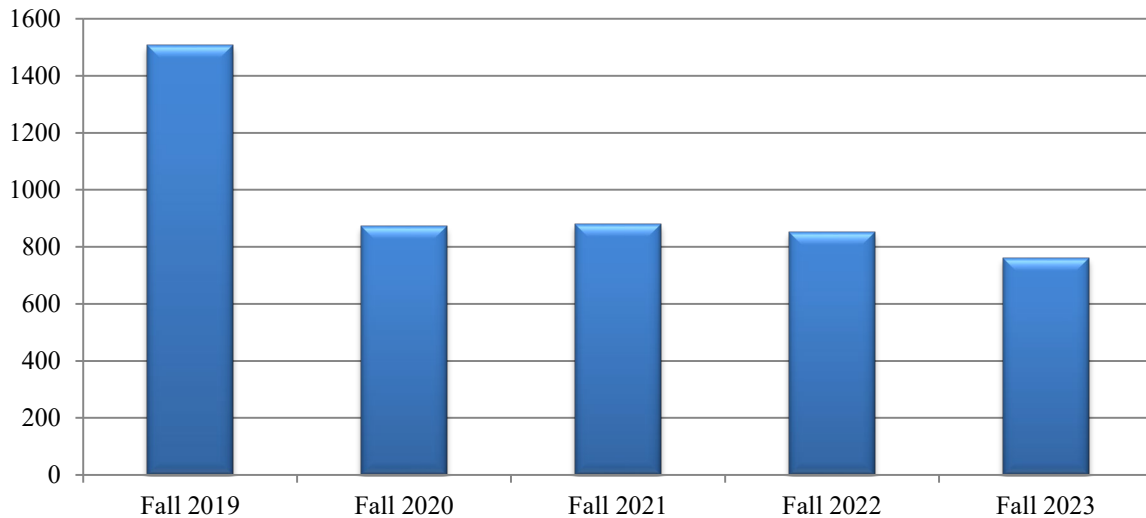

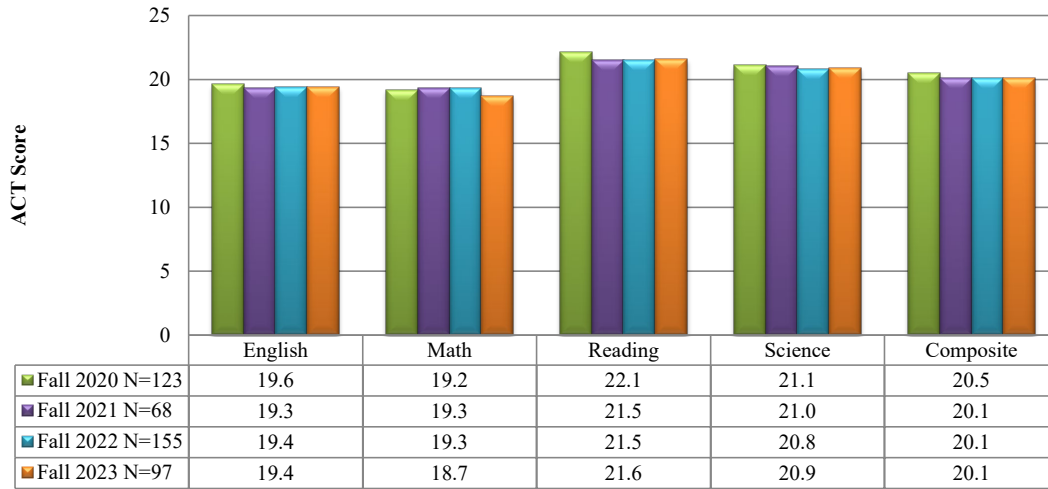
Pryor Headcount by Race/Ethnicity



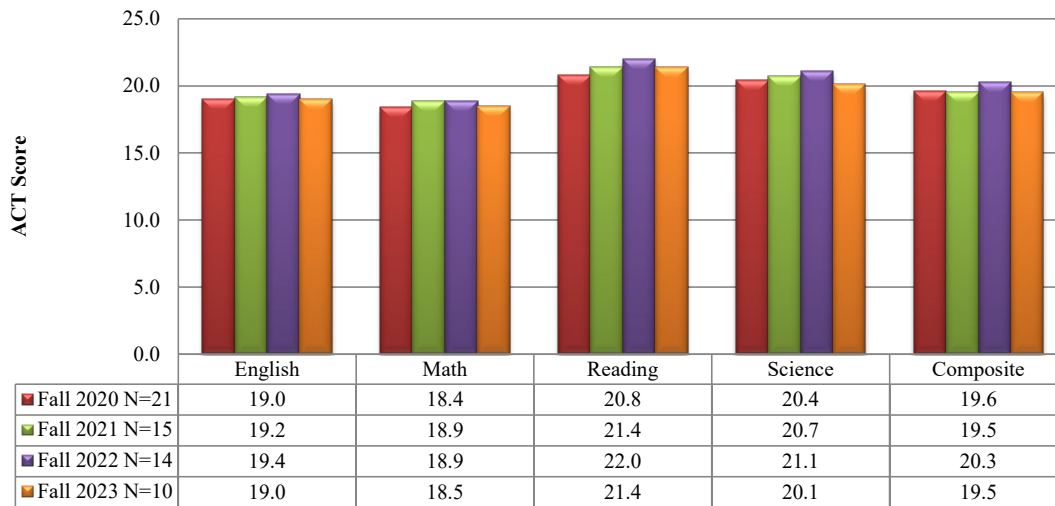

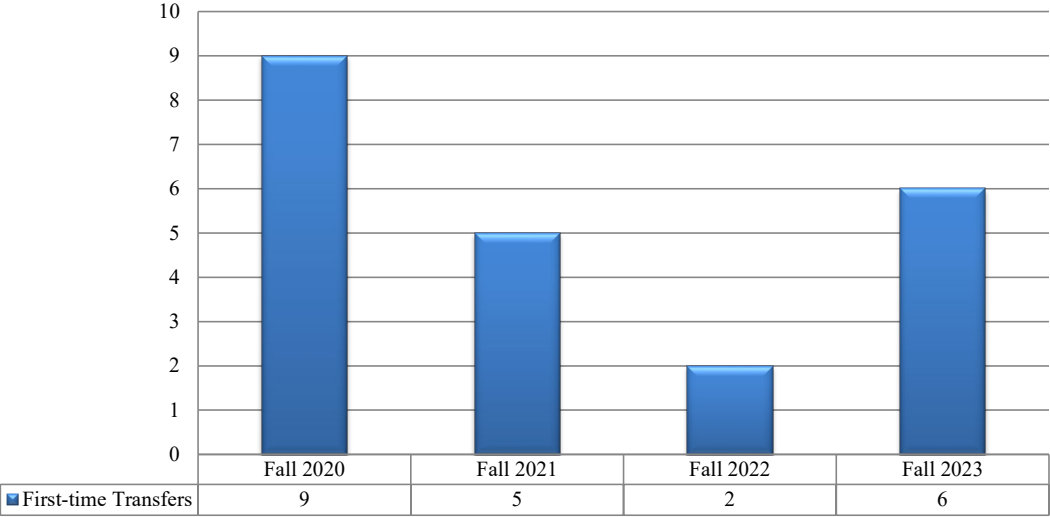
Average ACT for Pryor Students Who Submitted Scores

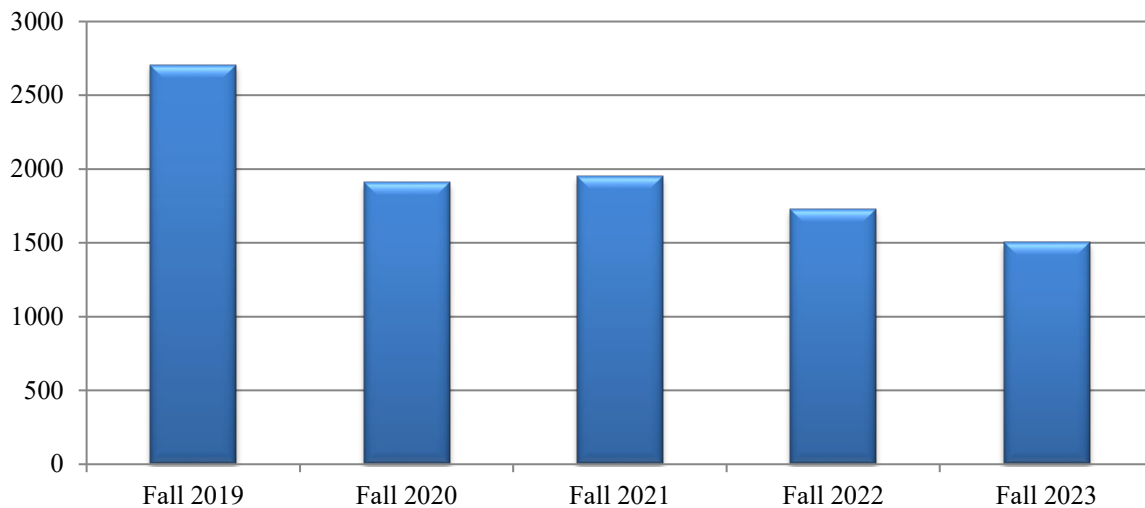

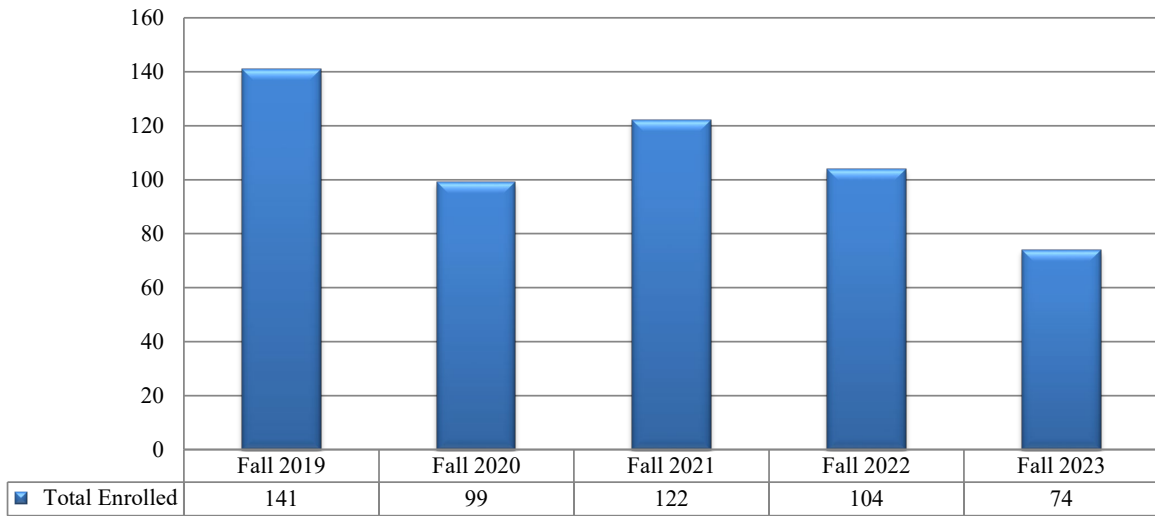

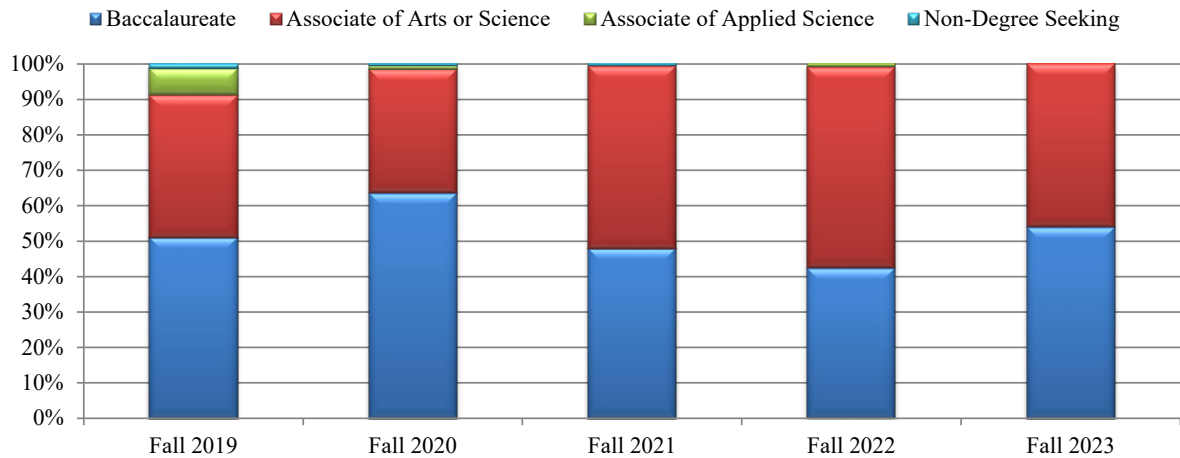

Bartlesville Concurrent High School Student Headcount

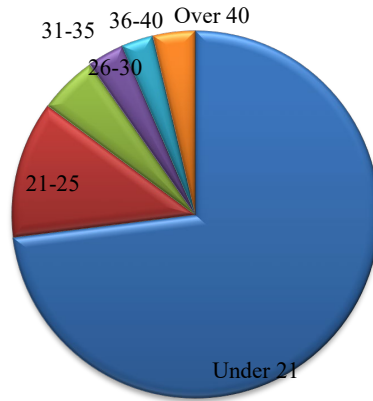


Bartlesville Headcount by Goal

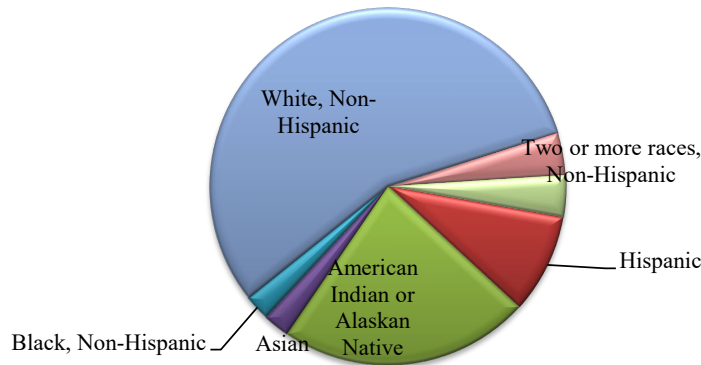
Bartlesville Headcount by Age

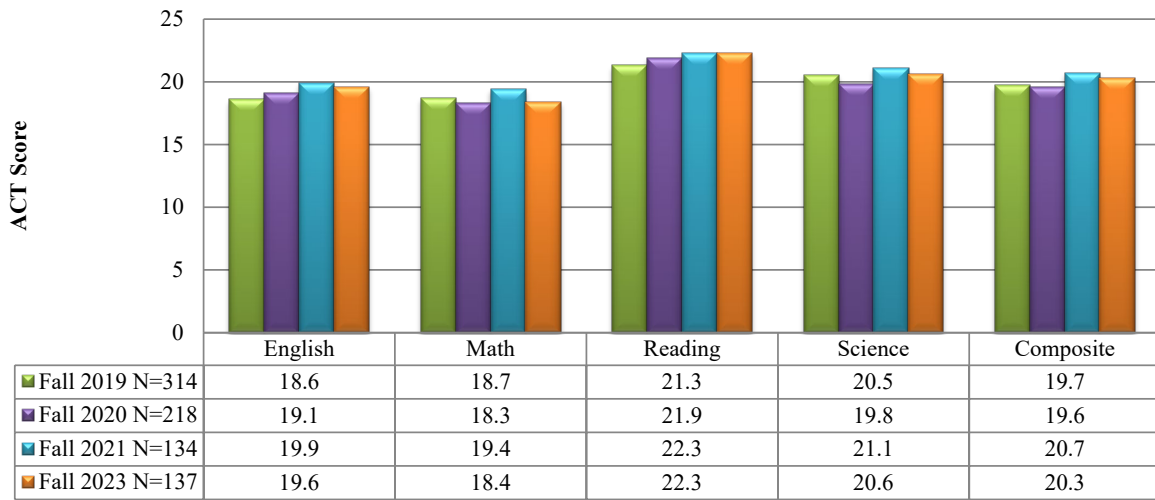
Bartlesville Headcount by Race/Ethnicity



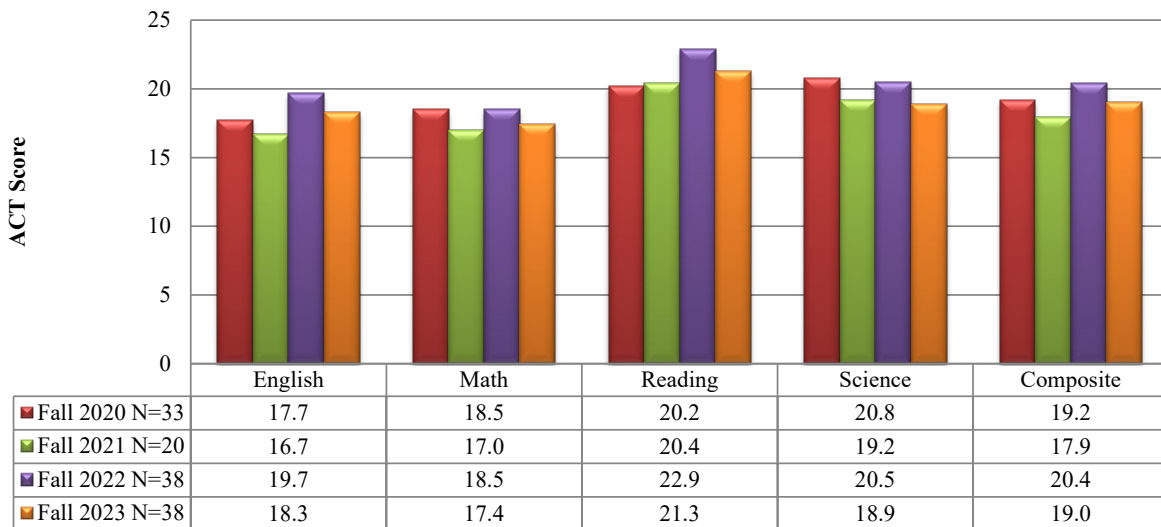

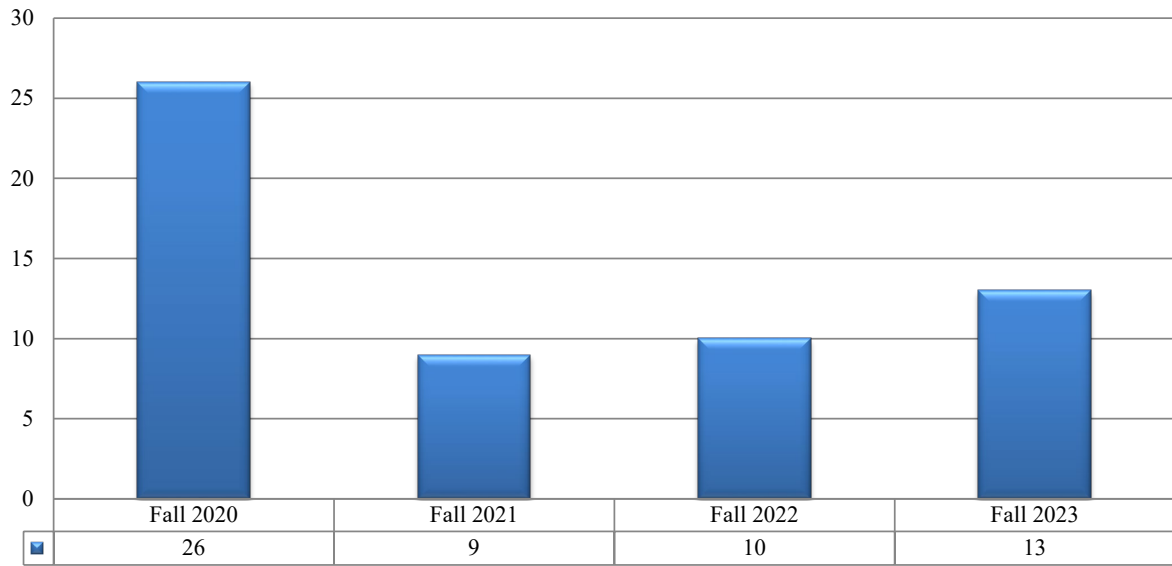
Average ACT for Bartlesville Students Who Submitted Scores

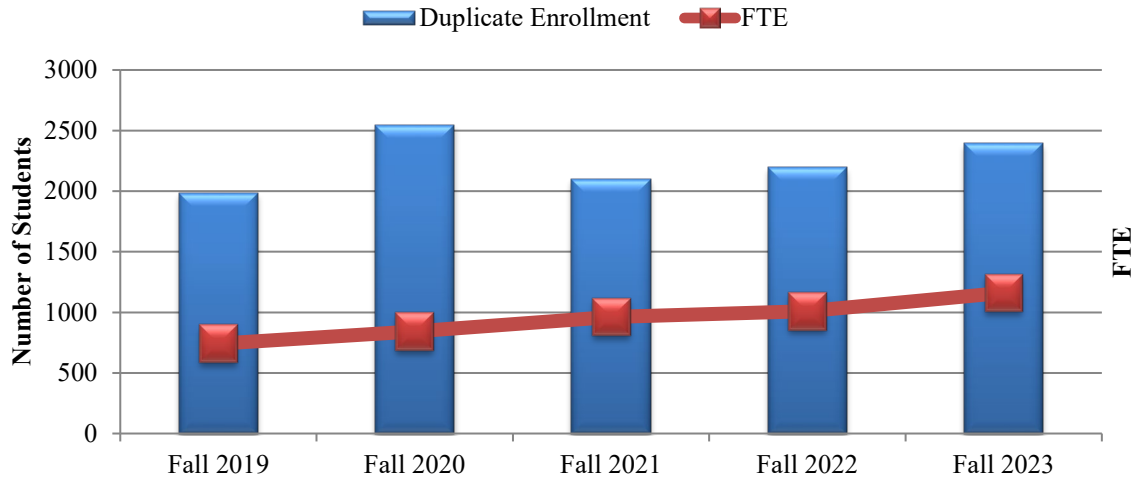

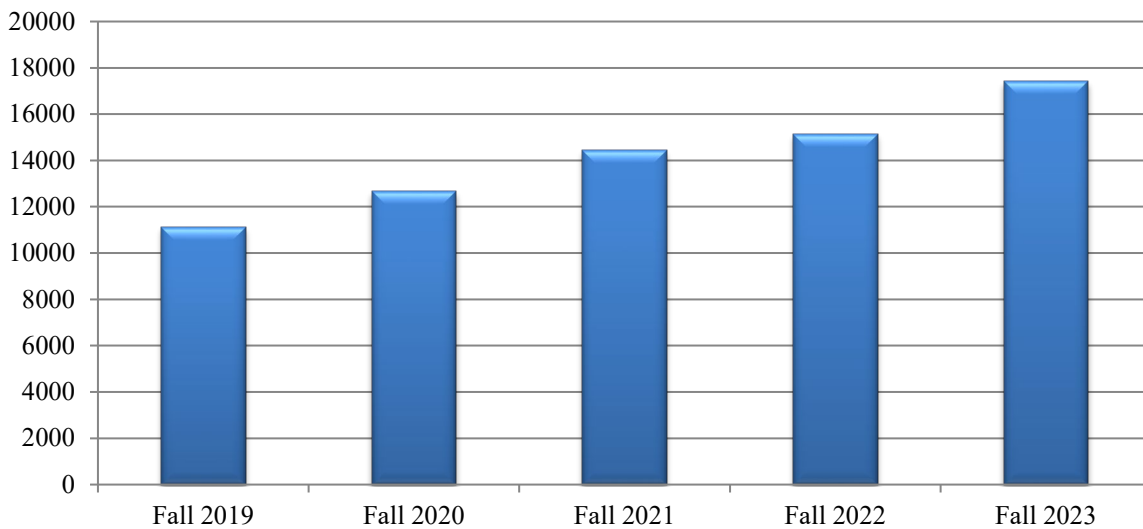

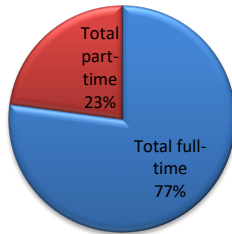
Online Headcount by Gender and Level

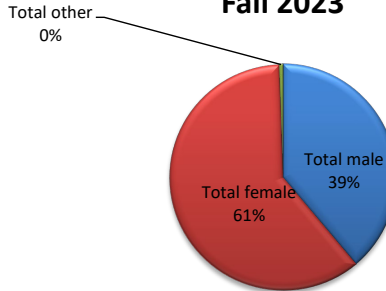

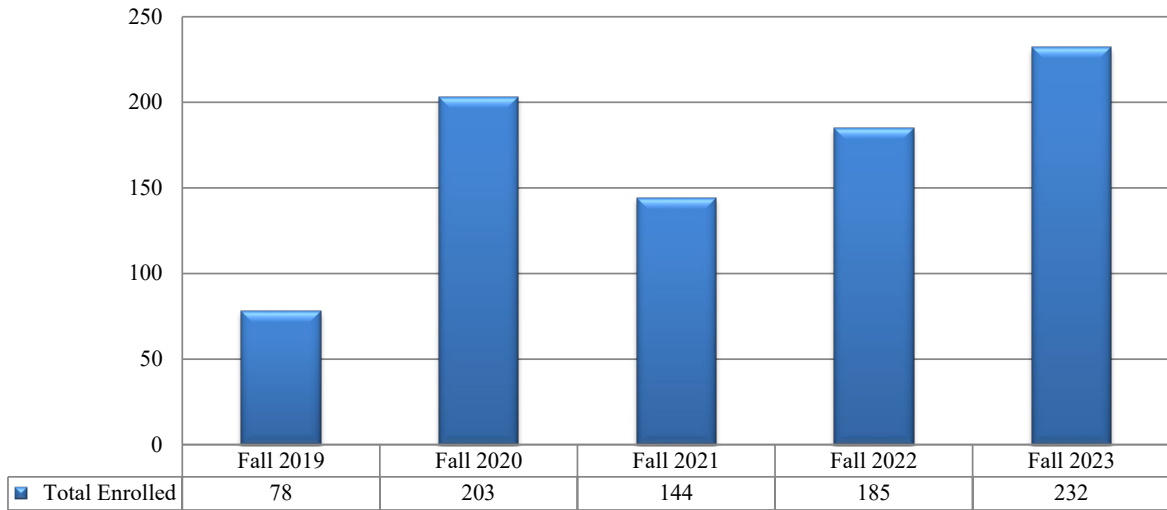

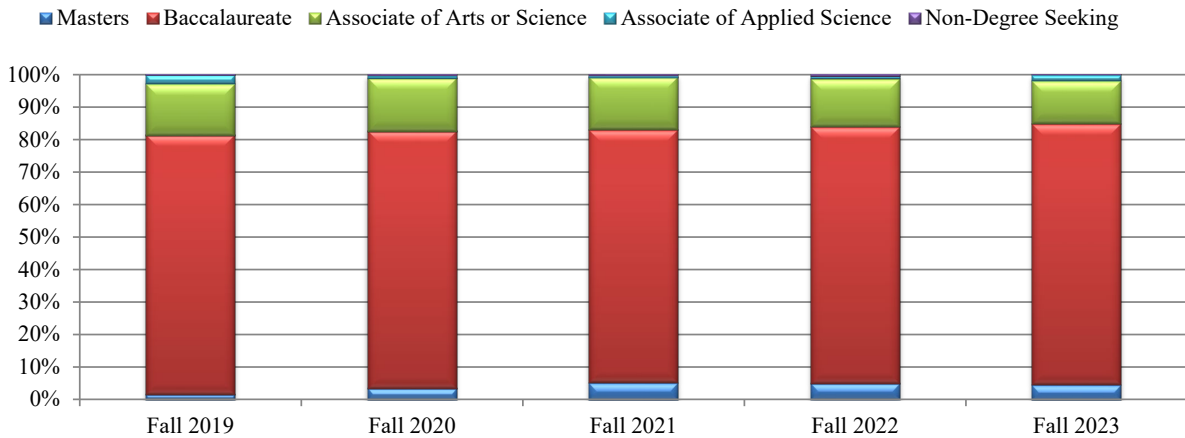

Online Concurrent High School Student Headcount

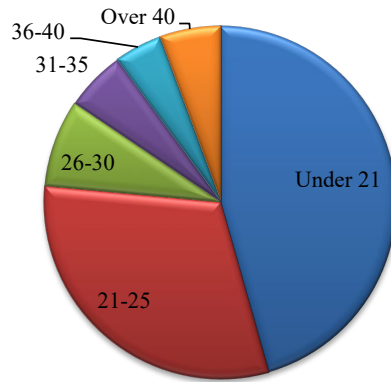


Online Headcount by Goal

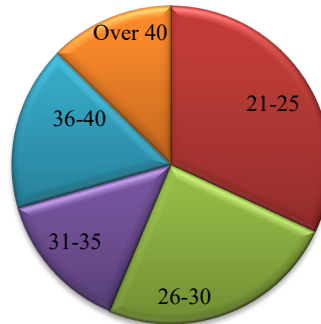
Online Headcount by Age

Online Headcount by Age- Graduate

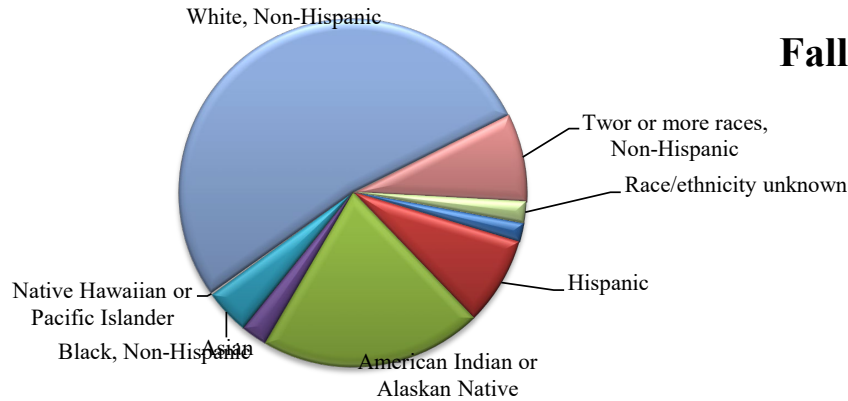

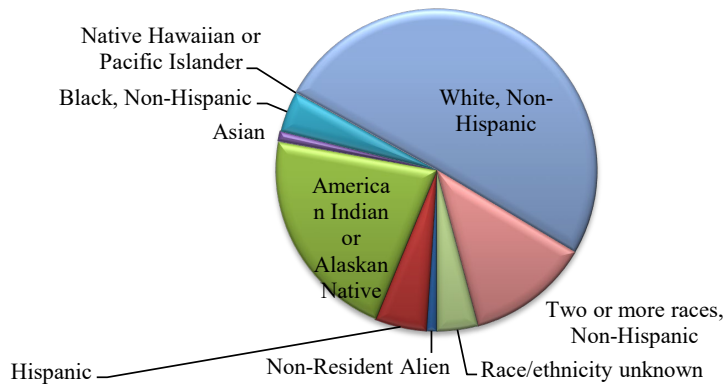

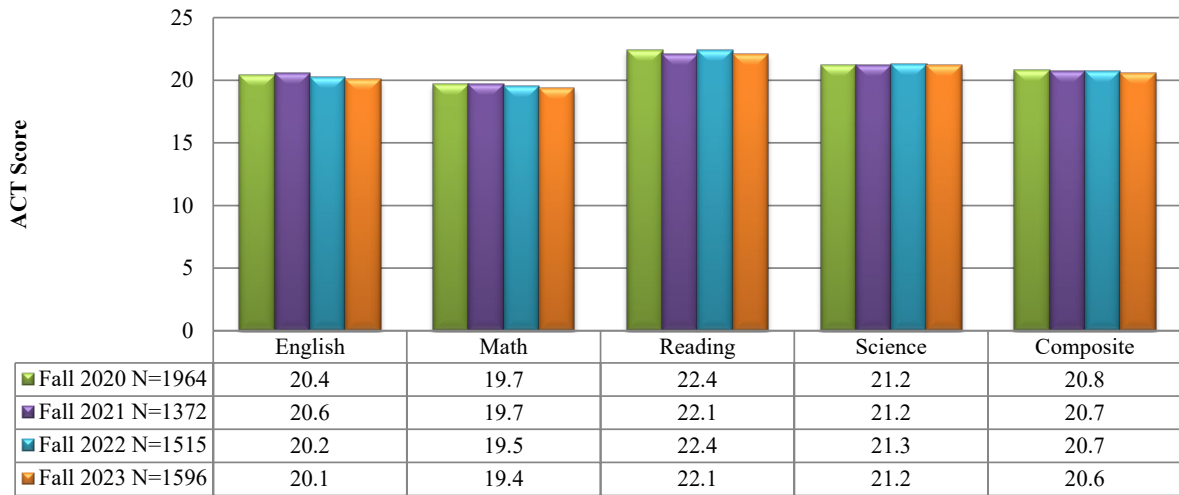
Online Headcount by Race/Ethnicity- Graduate



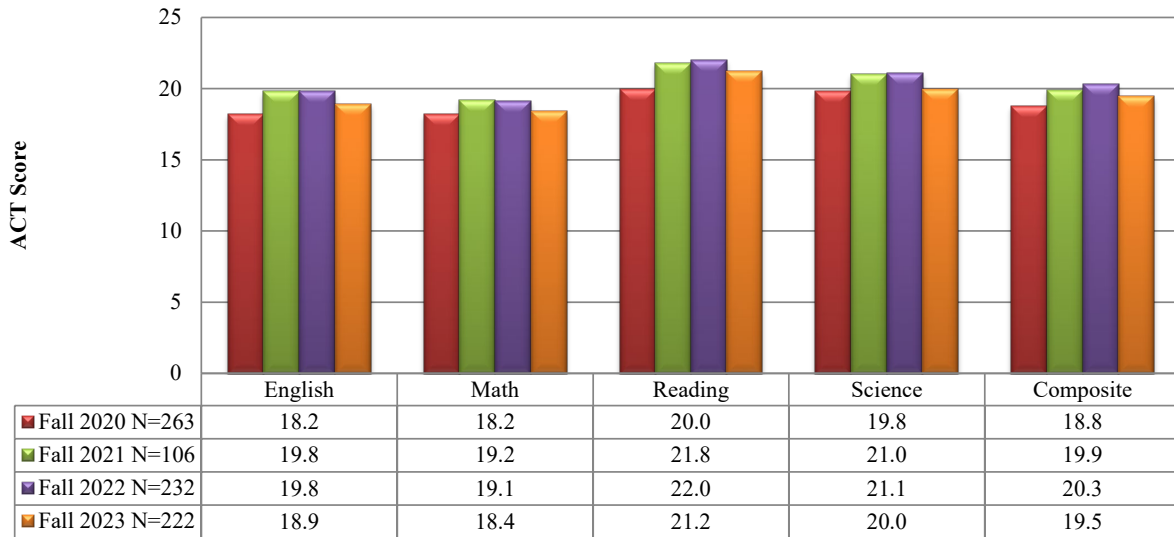

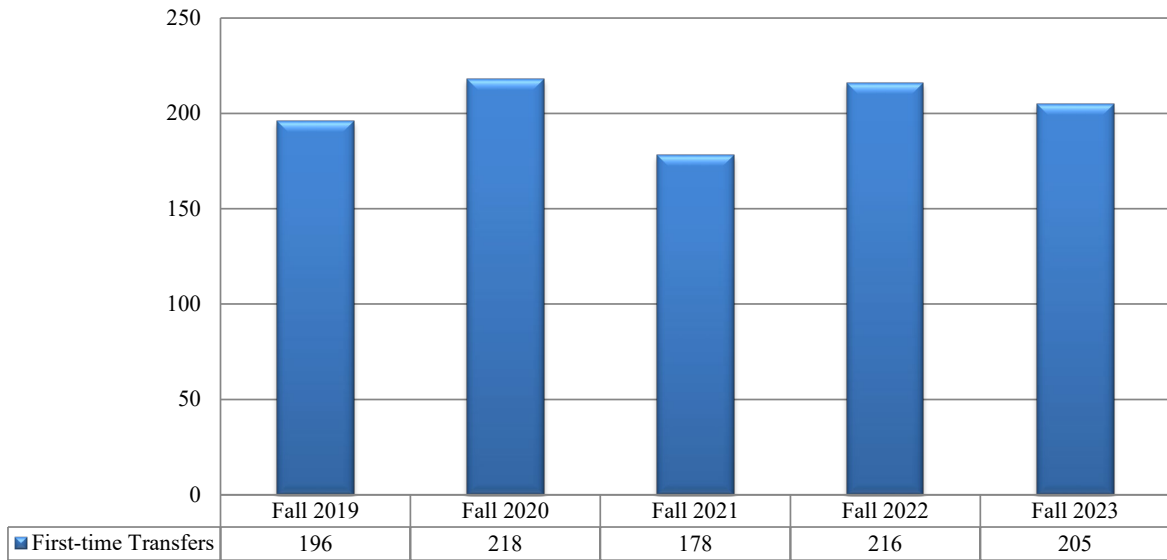
Average ACT for Online Students Who Submitted Scores

Glossary of Terms

- **Credit (Semester) Hour**—One 75 minute class period per week in a subject for one 16 week semester. Most college level courses are 3-5 credit hours.
- **Audit**—A student not interested in obtaining a course grade, but who is enrolled simply to gain course information. No credit hours will be awarded for “audit” enrollments.
- **Full-time**—A student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Part-time**—A student enrolled in less than 12 credit hours for a regular semester (fall or spring) or less than 6 credit hours for a summer session.
- **Duplicated Count**—Count includes duplicate student enrollment at more than one campus. For example, if a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, the student will be counted twice.
- **Unduplicated Count**—Each student is counted one time based on a hierarchical standard (Claremore, Online, Pryor, and Bartlesville). If a student is enrolled at Claremore and Pryor, in the unduplicated count, the student will only be included in the Claremore headcount.
- **Site**—A Rogers State University (RSU) campus, online education or technology center education. RSU has four main sites: Claremore, Pryor, Bartlesville, and Online.
- **Classification**
 - **Freshman**—A student who has earned less than 30 credit hours.
 - **Sophomore**—A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
 - **Junior**—A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
 - **Senior**—A student who has earned 90 or more credit hours.
- **First-time Freshman**—A first-time student who has not previously attended college or who has attempted less than 7 college level credit hours excluding credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **First-time Transfer**—A first-time student who is transferring at least 7 college level credit hours including F’s, and excluding W’s and credit hours attempted while a concurrent high school student.
- **Concurrent High School Student**— A high school student who meets the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education admission requirements allowing enrollment in college level courses.
- **Non-Degree Seeking**—An enrolled student who is not seeking a degree. Usually, the student is admitted without documentation (e.g. transcripts, entry-level testing) and can enroll in up to nine (9) credit hours before required to submit admission documentation.

Glossary of Funding Terms

- **E & G 1**—Educational and General 1 fund. Used to support general educational operations, including faculty salaries, operating expenses of instructional departments, library operations and acquisitions, general administration, student services, campus security, operation and maintenance of educational and general buildings and facilities. The Educational and General Fund accounts for all assets and resources are used for financing the instruction and general administration of the university. Typically, state appropriations, tuition, and other income are the revenue sources.
- **E & G 2**—Education and General 2 fund. Used to support programs funded by federal, state and local grants, as well as gifts and donations.
- **Auxiliary**—Fund used to support business type activities including food services, print shop, mail room, child development center and motor pool, and other activities which operate on a fee for service basis.
- **Capital**—Fund used to account for funds obtained for purchase of equipment and building construction.
- **Instruction**—This category includes expenditures for most activities that are part of an institution's instruction program.
- **Public Service**—This category includes funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups associated with particular sectors of the community outside the institution, such as community service programs (excluding instructional activities), cooperative extension services, conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services.
- **Academic Support**—This category includes funds expended primarily to provide support services for the institution's three primary missions (primary programs)--instruction, research, and public service.
- **Student Services**—This category includes funds expended for the admissions and registrar's offices and for activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to a student's emotional and physical well-being and intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of a formal instruction program.
- **Institutional Support**—This category includes expenditures for central executive-level activities involving management and long-range planning for the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; fiscal operations, including the investment office; administrative data processing; space management; and employee personnel and records.
- **Operation and Maintenance of Plant**—This category includes all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of physical plant, in all cases net of amounts charged to auxiliary enterprises, hospitals, and independent operations; expenditures for operations established to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities; utilities, fire protection, and certain types of maintenance expenditures.
